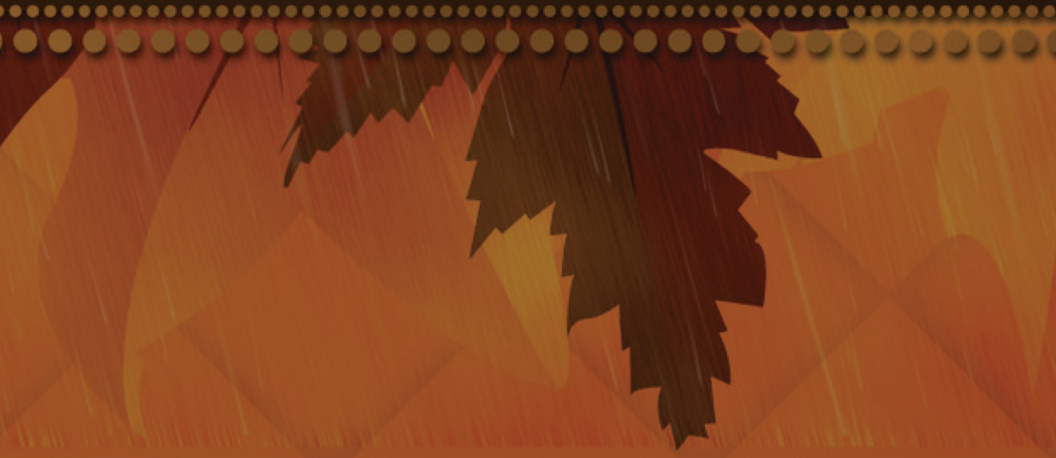

Session 2 - Can God Trust You?

2 Chronicles 16:9a

Introduction: Every blessing is a test to see if God might trust us with more. There is only ONE requirement of a good steward: faithful.

1 Corinthians 4:2 (note Proverbs 28:20)

Faithfulness has to do with faith (acting on what we read).

Faithfulness is part of our testimony.

Faithfulness makes a GREAT church member.

Faithfulness ENRAGES the Devil.

How important is faithfulness to a spouse? Friend? Employee? Pastor? God?

(Note: Lamentations 3:21-26)

Can God trust you?

Every blessing is a TEST to see if God might trust us with more. Most Christians become more obsessed with the blessings than they do the blesser.

The more we have, it seems the less we pray and depend on God. Whatsoever is not of faith is sin. Romans 14:23

There is only ONE requirement of a good steward: faithful.

In the text God is looking for someone who is single-minded..."perfect" means "whole" ... un-divided: someone who, "in all their ways, acknowledge Him." Proverbs 3:5-6. Remember: For the Christian, nothing should be secular!

1. God trusts those who are tried and proven.

Illustration: Abraham offering his only son, Isaac.

2. God trusts those with more who have honored Him with little.

3. God trusts those who have their priorities in order. Matthew 6:33

4. God trusts those who delight in Him.

5. God trusts those who recognize and realize His Lordship.

Conclusion: Can God trust YOU with more time? Opportunities? Money? Promotions? Things? "No good thing will he withhold from him that walketh uprightly."

Session 3 - The Glory of Glorifying God

John 15:8

Introduction: What is fruit for? To eat! We are to let others " Taste the Lord " of the Lord when they meet us and know us. Where does fruit come from? Abiding in the vine (Christ) !

There is a law that is unfailing !

For whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. Galatians 6:7

The laws of God are unfailing, therefore, when we live by them through the Holy Spirit, we will bear much fruit !

I will walk at liberty for I seek they precepts. Psalm 119:45

1. You reap if you sow. (What will you do with what God has placed in your hands?)

2. You reap where you sow. (Fields)

3. You reap what you sow. (What do you need? What do you want? Will it glorify God?)

4. You reap how you sow. (Liberally or sparingly?)

5. You reap more than you sow. (Corn)

6. You reap later than you sow. (Sow every day so you will not have a failed season!)

7. You reap to sow again .

Conclusion: The law of sowing can be positive and negative.
