Dear Dyersburg FUMC Family,

What a glorious Easter celebration we had, and I am so grateful that I was able to share it with all of you! I want to say thank you from the bottom of my heart to all of you who helped make it so beautiful, from the Easter flowers in the Sanctuary to the flowering cross outside, and everything in between!

I want to provide an update on the work that our Lay Leadership Team is doing, and, even more, I want to invite you to participate in the **vibrant** and **vital** life of our congregation. Lay Leadership (formerly Nominations) has long been perceived as the people who call you and ask you to be on a committee, but we hope that we can change that perception! 
