PASTORAL THOUGHTS

Good Morning! My name is Mark Hayes. I have been a member of this church since 1988. It is my privilege to currently serve this church as the Chair of the Church Council.

The church council is made up of the chairs of the administrative and ministry teams, including the church trustees, nominations team, staff-parish team, finance team, communications team, formation team, worship team, congregational care team, evangelism team, missions team, safe sanctuary team, youth council, the lay leader, the delegates to annual conference, the pre-school committee, and (certainly not least) our minister.

Church council usually meets on a Monday night in even-numbered months. Team chairs and church staff provide reports on their team's activities and plans. We review our church's state of financial affairs and try to take care of the needs of our physical property, our ministry teams, and the needs of our church. Transitions are never easy, but what I know is He is always faithful in times of transition. We studied one of my favorite passages this week in Sunday School, Joshua crossing the Jordan. I love this passage because of the symbolism that is present. When you look at the similarities between Moses crossing the Red Sea and Joshua, it is a great reminder that the Lord has been faithful in the past and in the present. I love the symbolism at the end of the passage when the 12 tribes build their tower of stones to remind themselves and their future ancestors of when God helped bring them to the promised land like He promised by helping them cross the Jordan. It always makes me wonder if maybe the ancestors would ever go back to it and add rocks to the ways God has been faithful in their present. I do not know if they physically added rocks, but I am sure that mentally they thought of many ways God continued to be faithful. Joshua 4 always reminds me to look back on the ways God has been faithful and to be expectant of the ways He will be present in the future and to be intentional about how I will remember those moments. Reading Joshua 4 reminded me of how the Lord has been faithful to me during transitions. I thought this passage came at the perfect time because I trust that God will be faithful as the youth and all of you continue your journey together here, and God will be faithful as I begin a new journey. My prayer for ya'll as a church is that you continue to be the great church you are, serving and caring for the needy, loving each other well, and loving the Lord deeply.
