PASTORAL THOUGHTS

Good Morning, my name is Carrie Newsom and I am a lifelong member of the Dyersburg First United Methodist Church. I am grateful to be here today and speak to you all as the finance chair.

While I am very happy to report that we have strong reserves, I want to also communicate that we do have a weakened income stream. I can assure you that at this time our church leadership is looking to better utilize our buildings, our budgeted expenses, and our reserves; But, we are also asking for innovative ideas as it pertains to these areas.

As I mentioned, we do currently have strong reserves. These funds come from the many years of joyful and generous giving by our members both past and present. We, as a church have held fast to the teachings of our founder, John Wesley, who taught us to earn all you can, save all you can, and give all you can.

Most importantly, giving for Wesley was a means of expressing generosity rooted in gratitude for God's generosity, and a means of fulfilling the great commandment to love God and neighbor. He was convinced, that if the Methodists would give all they can, then all would have enough.

While preparing for this morning, I pulled out a book on my shelf that was given to church leadership, I believe, back in 2020. The book is titled "Quietly Courageous" and was written by Gil Rendle. I opened to a chapter titled, 'A word about enough.'

The author talks about a United Methodist bishop who was looking at his area as a geographical map in which he could locate his congregations and leaders. In looking geographically he could locate some strengths, but also recognized there were considerable weaknesses and a host of problems that needed to be solved. From this perspective, he felt weighted down not only with the responsibilities of his own agency but also, with his lack of resources.

Through his wisdom, he realized, he could take a different approach and look at his area as an energy map instead of a geographical map. By looking at his area as an energy map, he was able to ask where there was already movement, where there were already differences being made, where there were already experiments and initiatives building up, and where there were already people excited by their purposes. In other words, he was asking where God's agency was already at work, and those agencies showed up as energy.

The bishop came to understand that by focusing and getting behind the energy it lead him to see the "enough" that is already at work. For our church we may no longer have what is needed to continue to do what has always been done, but there are sufficient resources for what we are currently called to do. THERE is ENOUGH.

I want to challenge us all to look at our church as an energy map, and ask where God's spirit is calling us to fulfill our purpose of changing lives and this community in vital and faithful ways. I too, am convinced, that if, and when, we give all we can in our time, talents, and treasures, there will be enough.

If you have talents related to innovative thinking, financial planning, and feel called to serve as a part of our financial committee, I hope that you will join us. If you have gifts related to other areas on our energy map, or if you feel called to create a different movement of energy, I pray that you allow God to work in you to spread His love.

Our ability to be generous is a gift, and as John Wesley told us, we are called to
