#### PASTORAL THOUGHTS

My name is J Dan Gullett and I have the privilege today of talking to you about the Worship Team, but before I do, I'd like to begin with worship in general. Have you ever wondered why we do certain things during worship? Well, it all began with John Wesley when, in 1784, he gave written instructions to the new Methodists in North America for what to include in worship.

Over time, The United Methodist Hymnal (1989) and The United Methodist Book of Worship (1992) have become our official worship resources and are the cornerstones of our worship. You may have noticed that, in addition to the hymns that we sing, the hymnal includes The Basic Pattern of Worship and An Order of Sunday Worship Using the Basic Pattern. And then, there are the formats for the celebration of the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Baptism as well as others.

In addition, the United Methodist Church uses *The Revised Common Lectionary*, which is a calendar of suggested scripture readings for a three-year period. There are four readings assigned to each Sunday, and the pastor's sermon is most often based on one of these scriptures.

In addition to the scripture selections, The General Board of Discipleship of The United Methodist Church suggests hymns for each of the scripture readings and are usually used in our worship service.

So, it might seem that if so much of what we do in worship each week is prescribed, why do we need a Worship Team at all? Plus, since worship is an individual experience, why do we need a committee or team to assist with that individual experience?

A Dictionary for United Methodists describes the Worship Team as the work area designed to assist the local church to become increasingly aware of the meaning, purpose and practice of worship. The Worship Team coordinates with the pastor and other worship leaders when needed.

The Worship Team at DFUMC is composed of seven church members and the pastor. Except for the pastor, the members are what might be described as behind-the-scenes workers.

For example, have you ever wondered how the juice served during Holy Communion gets into those little plastic cups? Well, a member of the Worship Team makes that happen prior to the service and then after the service makes sure that the unused elements are discarded in a respectful manner.

Or, what about how the church gets decorated for Advent, Christmas, and Easter? Two members of the Worship Team coordinate the work of the Altar Guild. These two and their band of helpers create beauty around the church, especially here in the sanctuary, to make the church conducive to worship.

What about the lay liturgists, ushers, greeters, communion stewards, acolytes and cross bearers? How is it that these people are always present in our worship services? Again, members of the Worship Team recruit, provide training and schedule these individuals.

And what about the bulletin and the information on the four monitors? While the creation of the bulletin is done primarily by the pastor, the Choir Director and the church administrative assistant, a member of the Worship Team lays eyes on the bulletin and offers suggestions as needed. Preparing the visual slides for the worship service is also done by a member of the Worship Team. So, being on the Worship Team requires time and commitment. But, we



possible experience for the congregation's worship of God. For us to worship, we need a sense of expectancy – we come expecting to meet God, to be in God's presence, to give God praise, to hear God speak, to respond to God's call and to be touched by God's grace. Your Worship Team strives to bring all of this about each time we gather to worship.

I will now give my 30-second elevator speech to describe to someone my feelings about DFUMC, but it's hard to compress 74 years into 30 seconds. I was baptized in this sanctuary a few months after my birth in May 1949. My parents were dedicated members of this church and expected the same dedication from me. And what blessings I received over the years from countless saints who taught me in Sunday School, VBS, choir and MYF. Except for a five-year period during which I moved my membership to the First UMC in Ripley, where Jackie and I were living and teaching, I have been a member of this church. Our children were confirmed here and, later, they both married here. Three of our grandchildren have been baptized here and worship with us.

God speaks about holy ground when he tells Moses "Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." I think about the one hundred years of ministry that have gone before us in this very spot. Truly, we are standing on holy ground each time we enter this Sanctuary. Can you imagine the number of sermons, confessions of faith, confirmations, weddings, celebrations of life, and the number of times that the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion have breathed life into this church? And, even more so, I think in awe of the number of prayers that most certainly have been raised to Almighty God in this room.

But, it's not just the past that I think about when I enter the sanctuary. For me, the words of the song *In This Very Room*, which Kathy played for us a few Sunday's ago, describe my feelings. The closing lyrics are "In this very room, there's quite enough love for all the world. And in this very room, there's quite enough joy for all the world. And there's quite enough hope and quite enough power to chase away any gloom. For Jesus, Lord Jesus, is in this very room." With that wonderful news and the 100-year-old history of this place, how could I be anywhere else? Thank you.
