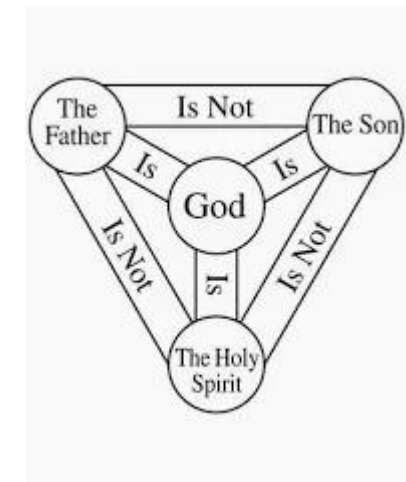

Liturgical Seasons

Now that we are beyond Easter and Pentecost, what is the current season of the Christian Year? Since last Sunday was Pentecost Sunday, we now begin the Season After Pentecost, which is also called Ordinary Time.

Ordinary Time begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent.

The first Sunday in this season is always Trinity Sunday, which we celebrate today. The last Sunday is always the Sunday of the Reign of Christ or Christ the King. The current season also includes All Saints Sunday and Thanksgiving Sunday.

Enjoy the white paraments in the chancel today. Next Sunday, the paraments will be green, symbolizing "growth and life," and, except for All Saints Sunday and Christ the King Sunday, will remain green until the first Sunday in Advent.
