MISSION MOMENT

Good morning! My name is David Wagner, and I am a member of our First United Methodist Church Missions Committee. I was raised a Methodist attending Forest Heights United Methodist Church in Jackson, TN and now have been a member at Dyersburg FUMC for about 20 years. For reasons I don't really know, I was not baptized as an infant at Forest Heights.but my older sister was. As I look back now I think that may have been the time that the partiality for my sister began. But God had a plan for me!! We adopted our daughter Leah in 2003 and brought her back to the United States. She was 13 months old and had not been baptized. In the spring of 2003, Leah and I were both baptized in this church together. I love the Reaffirmation of Baptismal Covenant service we have each year. When Mary Beth traces the cross on my forehead and tells me "remember your baptism". It is very special because I do remember my baptism in this church with my daughter Leah. I believe God had that planned for me all along. I also firmly believe God has a plan for this church in our missions.

The purpose of our Mission Committee is to:

- Educate, inform, and motivate the congregation about mission outreach and their part in it.
- Help involve members of our congregation in mission and service projects in our church, our community, and around the world
- Connect to work being done by other groups within the congregation
- Report to the congregation on the benefits of its outreach

When we hear about church missions, we often think of big, organized programs like annual church mission trips far from home. But Jesus often talked about missions as simply helping the people we encounter every day. A mission for our church can be as simple as hanging a picture for an elderly member to larger projects such as re-building a new house after a major storm. My retirement job that I have recently taken with the Tennessee Western Kentucky Conference and UMCOR has me working with volunteers from many United Methodist Churches from across the country rebuilding and repairing homes after the December 2021 tornadoes that hit West Tennessee and Western Kentucky. Several of these churches consider themselves as "Missional" churches. It's interesting to talk to them about the way they serve their church, their community and beyond. The common theme they all say is that every member of their church is also a member of their mission committee. Let me repeat that: Every member of their church is also a member of their mission committee.

In a few weeks we will announce a date for a hamburger and hotdog lunch after church. I would love everyone to bring your ideas of ways that we can serve our church, our community and beyond. Again, these don't have to be monumental, tour bus mission trips. They can be as simple as helping someone pull some weeds and everything in between. We'll get more information out soon about the date for the lunch.

Now, as previous folks have done, I will share my 30 second elevator speech: Welcome to First United Methodist Church. We hope you will find our church family to be warm and welcoming. Our church was founded in 1844 and has
