"Passing of the Peace."

This heading in a worship bulletin strikes fear in the hearts of many. It is an action that often seems awkward, out of place, and frivolous. Dyersburg FUMC eliminated it from our order of worship during the height of COVID and it has stayed away since then. Perhaps it is time to resume this practice.

In the Service of Word and Table found in our United Methodist Hymnal, the Invitation to the Table includes these words: Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, and seek to live in peace with one another.

When the Confirmands and I dive deeply into the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion, I explain that the invitation consists of three separate ways that individuals can examine their own hearts and lives as they prepare to come to Christ's table.

Do I love God?

Have I repented of my sin?

Am I at peace with my brothers and sisters in Christ?

The answer to the first question is implied in the person's presence in worship. That person is present in worship because he or she loves God. We confess our sin together as part of the liturgy in response to the second question. I tell the Confirmands that if the answer to the second question is "no," then you have the chance to take care of it in our communal confession. Finally, we share the peace of Christ in response to the third question.

The opportunity to "pass the peace" as part of the



Communion liturgy is not intended to be a social event. It is intended to be a moment in which Christians can offer each other signs of reconciliation as we prepare to approach Christ's table. In Matthew 5, Jesus tells those gathered with him that if they are on their way to make a sacrifice on the altar to God and remember that a brother or sister has something against them, they should first be reconciled to their brother or sister, and then come back and make their sacrifice.

For example, if Jay and I have had an argument before church on a Sunday morning and the invitation to the table has been given, "passing the peace" gives me the chance to go to him and offer him a sign of reconciliation. Perhaps we might apologize to each other and offer each other forgiveness. If you happen to be sitting near someone you don't know, or if you don't have any need to offer reconciliation to your brothers and sisters, you are simply encouraged to offer a handshake and say, "May the peace of Christ be with you." An appropriate response is "And also with you."

I know that some folks are anxious that the passing of the peace will go on forever-long after they have offered signs of reconciliation to their neighbors. I will do my best to ensure that this piece of the liturgy is an appropriate length so as not to cause discomfort. Please do not feel as though you need to make small talk—that's not the intention of this time. Simply offer signs of reconciliation to your neighbors in ways that are comfortable for you—a handshake, a wave, a hug—as we prepare to share the meal that Christ has prepared for us.
