Epistle Lesson

Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16 NSRV

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. ⁸By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance, and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹By faith, with Sarah's involvement, he received power of procreation even though he was too old, because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹²Therefore, from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore." ¹³All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, 14 for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better homeland, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

The Christian Year

The current cycle in the Christian Year is "Ordinary Time." The designated color during this cycle or season is green except for the Sundays when we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion. On those special days, white is the color.

The word "ordinary" does not mean "routine" or "not special." Instead, it refers to the "ordinal numbers" (first, second, third, etc.) used to name and count the Sundays (such as the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost).

In the Christian Year, there are two periods of Ordinary Time. We are in the second period of Ordinary Time, which is the Season after Pentecost. This second period begins the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost.

Ordinary Time on the Christian calendar is a time for action. Evangelism, discipleship and living out God's call are all central activities during the two periods of Ordinary Time each year.
