My friends,

Our 2026 Stewardship Campaign is coming soon! For the three Sundays of November—between All Saints and Advent—we'll begin an ongoing conversation about what it means to be a Methodist.

In his essay "The Character of a Methodist," John Wesley writes that the mark of a Methodist "is one who has the love of God shed abroad in his heart by the Holy Spirit given unto him." At our core, Methodists are people who love God and love neighbor. That means stewardship is about far more than money—it's about how we give our whole selves to God.

When we join the church, we promise to serve God through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Each of these vows is an act of love, a way of participating in God's transforming work in our church and community.

As we begin prayerfully considering our commitments for 2026, I invite you to reflect on how you will offer your whole life to grow in your love of God and neighbor. In the coming weeks, you'll receive a letter and pledge card. These will invite you not only to make your financial commitment but also to renew your commitment to pray, to show up, to serve, and to share your faith.

From November 9 through November 23, we'll explore these commitments more deeply through scripture and Wesley's words, listening together for the Spirit's call to greater oneness in love in the year ahead.


