PASTORAL THOUGHTS

Dear Friends in Christ,

I was thrilled with the response I received on Sunday as we kicked off our stewardship campaign, *The Character of a Methodist*. In my sermon on *presence*, I talked about the importance of showing up for one another especially in a world that is increasingly online and disconnected.

Sometimes, when I'm preaching, the Spirit will gently say something to me mid-sermon. On Sunday, as I spoke about the loneliness that plagues our culture, I truly felt God whisper, "this church does this so well." And it's true! As your pastor, I am continually blessed by the way so many of you come alongside me and often times go way before me and ahead of me in serving the community, caring for the sick, and sharing life together. Presence is one of our great strengths here at FUMC.

This Sunday, we'll turn our focus to our next vow - *prayer*. The following week, we'll talk about *service*. But before we get there, I want to share a thought about another vow that often gets overlooked: *witness*.

The word *witness* can sound intimidating. Some might wonder, "Am I required as a member of The United Methodist Church to blabber on to my barber or the grocery clerk about Jesus?" Maybe — but perhaps not in the way you think. John Wesley gives us a helpful reminder in his essay *The Character of a Methodist*: "Perfect love having now cast out fear, (a Methodist) rejoices evermore. (A Methodist) rejoices in the Lord always."

Wesley goes on to say that "the Spirit itself bears witness." In other words, our *love* is our *witness*, people see and know and experience God's love when we are loving out in the world. As the old hymn says, "They'll know we are Christians by our love."

To bear witness as United Methodists means to be radically loving - to bring joy to others by loving and serving them just as they are. When we live that way, the Spirit speaks volumes through us.

See you Sunday. Let's keep showing up, praying, serving, and loving - so that through us, the Spirit continues to bear witness to Christ in this place in 2026.




