The Nativity Presentation

The Children of Saint David's

Narrator

It began with a visit from an Angel one day. God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to speak with a virgin. She was engaged to marry a man named Joseph from the family of David. Her name was Mary. The Angel said to Mary, "Greetings! The Lord has blessed you and is with you."

Mary was startled by what the angel said and wondered what this greeting might mean. The angel said to her, "Don't be afraid Mary; God has shown you his grace. Listen! You will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of King David, his ancestor. He will rule over the people of Jacob forever, and his kingdom will never end."

Mary said to the angel, "How will this happen since I am a virgin"? The angel said to Mary, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will cover you. For this reason the baby will be holy and will be called the Son of God."

Narrator

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. Everyone went to his own town to register.

Joseph also left the town of Nazareth, a town in Galilee, and went to the town of Bethlehem in Judea, known as the town of David. Joseph went there because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.

While they were in Bethlehem, the time grew near for Mary to give birth. Joseph tried to find a place for them to stay in one of the inns, but because of the census, there were no rooms. They found their way to a stable where they made a bed from the hay and where Mary gave birth to a baby boy. She wrapped Him with pieces of cloth and laid him in a manger where the animals were fed.

And we earnestly desire your fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this, our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; asking you to grant that, by the merits and death of your Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his Blood, we and your whole Church may obtain forgiveness of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present to you, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice. We humbly pray that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, because of our many sins, to offer you any sacrifice, yet we ask you to accept this duty and service we owe, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
