FROM THE PASTOR.....

To My Church Family,

On Easter Sunday, I spoke about the undeniable power, the unparalleled possibility, and the unimaginable promise of new life that the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, offers to us—new life that's available to us, not just when we die, but here and now in the present as well. In the latter portion of May, we will begin a study of the book of Acts and will have an in-depth look at what the power, possibility, and promise of new life entails!

Our study of Acts will begin on May 16. Then on the following week, May 23, we will be reading Acts 2 and talking about Pentecost, the day the Church was born and the gift of the Holy Spirit was given to Jesus' disciples. But get this: May 23 happens to be Pentecost Sunday. That means we'll be learning about the very first Pentecost on Pentecost! May 23 is also the day that we'll be inviting newer members of our community to join us to learn more about our church during our First Steps group. I honestly didn't plan this at all! In my mind, this is a sign to all of us that God is indeed at work in our church, bringing restoration and renewal to all of our lives! I am so grateful that God gives us such tangible reminders of His grace.

Speaking of restoration and renewal, we will be hosting two very special worship services on May 30 and June 6. On May 30, Memorial Sunday, we will take time during service to acknowledge and lament all of the loss that our community has experienced over the course of the past year. The loss of life. The loss of normalcy. The loss of peace. But then, on June 6, we will gather for what we are calling New Beginning Sunday. It will be a service designed to help us all remember that God is in the business of fresh starts—that even though we have lost much in the past, God offers us the power, possibility, and promise of new life for both the present and the future. I hope you all can join us for New Beginning Sunday, especially those of you who are fully vaccinated and haven't had the opportunity to rejoin us for in-person worship yet!
