

#### PERSONALLY FROM THE PASTOR



If someone asked you to describe the book of Revelation, what adjectives would you use?

## Weird? Enigmatic? Difficult? Frustrating? *Frightening?*

I'll never forget the first time I read Revelation. It was a few days after 9/11. Like so many other Americans, I was worried that the unprecedented attacks heralded that the end of the world was imminent. So I picked up a Bible that I had received as a gift and turned to Revelation for answers, to see if John's prophecy matched up with what was happening in the world. I remember that as I read, I felt *afraid* that the worst was yet to come.

As I said this past Sunday, one of the major hurdles in studying Revelation is that we tend to bring interpretive baggage to the text. In my case, I had been taught somewhere along the line that Revelation essentially functions as a guidebook for the end times. That it explicitly predicts that a series of specific events will occur before Christ returns. If you know what these events entail, then you can prepare yourself for what's to come.

But what if I told you that this isn't how John intended Revelation to be read? What if I told you that John's focus isn't primarily on future (or past) events, but rather on living faithfully in the present *in light of past and future events*? What if I told you that Revelation isn't meant to scare us, but offer us encouragement and hope as we live our lives as dissident disciples in the midst of Babylon—in the midst of a culture that constantly calls us to conform to it?

To be sure, when we read Revelation well, we'll find that we might best describe it as <u>pertinent and important</u>. Eugene Peterson says it well:

"Revelation is a gift—a work of intense imagination that pulls its reader into a world of sky battles between angels and beasts, lurid punishments and glorious salvations, kaleidoscopic vision and cosmic song. It is a world in which children are instinctively at home and in which adults, by becoming as little children, recapture an elemental involvement in the basic conflicts and struggles that permeate moral existence, and then go on to discover again the soaring adoration and primal affirmations for which God made us."

I hope that you will read Revelation chapter-by-chapter each week as we make our way through it in worship. Here's our preaching schedule for this month:

August 6: Revelation 2 August 13: Revelation 3 August 20: Revelation 4 August 27: Revelation 5

#### **BACKPACKS AND SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR SUNSET**


