To My Church Family,

Somehow, a woodpecker got trapped inside of our house.

I was running some errands last Thursday when I decided to stop by my house to grab some lunch. As I walked to the kitchen, I heard the unmistakable sound of a bird flying into glass. I assumed that the bird was hitting a window from the outside, but that wasn't the case—it was, as I said, trapped inside (my best guess is that it entered through our chimney).

I wanted nothing more than to help the woodpecker find its way back to freedom. Slowly, I approached it, speaking in soothing tones. But the woodpecker, in its fear and confusion, misinterpreted my intentions. Every time I tried to guide it toward the backdoor, the bird darted in the opposite direction, crashing into walls and windows.

After what felt like hours, the woodpecker finally paused, exhausted, on the edge of the kitchen counter. Krista and the boys were home by this point. They joined me in my efforts. Maintaining a respectful distance, we all whispered words of encouragement and simply waited and watched, hoping the woodpecker would calm down enough to see the backdoor.

Rest was apparently what the woodpecker needed the most as it eventually found its way back outside. And as I watched it disappear into the trees, I couldn't help but to reflect on the theological significance of the experience.

You see, God desires to guide us toward a life of freedom and joy. But often, in our fear, confusion, and exhaustion, we end up turning in the wrong direction, crashing into obstacles of our own making. In the woodpecker's case, a brief moment of rest was all it needed to regain its senses. The same is true for us as well—when we slow down and listen in, it's possible for us to sense God's guiding presence.

May each of us strive to foster a healthy rhythm of rest and activity!


