## PERSONALLY FROM THE PASTOR

Did any of you make resolutions for 2024? I have to be honest that I stopped making resolutions several years ago because I realized that I always fail to maintain them! So in lieu of making resolutions, Krista and I started a new tradition a few years ago: on New Year's Eve, we each come up with a single word that we want to define our vision for the upcoming year. It's been a beneficial practice as it has allowed us to still pursue growth and change without having to worry about strictly adhering to a specific goal!

Over the past few weeks, I've been praying that God would help me come up with a word that would likewise help define the church's vision for 2024. And the word I keep coming back to is, "Relationships." I know that seems incredibly basic, considering that most of us attend church for the purpose of learning how to grow in our relationships with God and other people! But the reality is that we live in a broken world, which means that we can find it difficult to maintain relational health, even in our best relationships. N.T. Wright says it well:

"We are made for each other. Yet making relationships work, let alone making them flourish, is often remarkably difficult . . . we all know that we belong in communities, that we were made to be social creatures. Yet there are many times when we are tempted to slam the door and stomp off into the night by ourselves, simultaneously making the statement that we don't belong anymore and that we want someone to take pity on us, to come to the rescue and comfort us. We all know we belong in relationships, but we can't quite work out how to get them right . . ."

In light of this, we'll begin the year with a short sermon series about God's faithfulness to us; His unwavering consistency, reliability, trustworthiness, and commitment is the bedrock of *all* relationships. Then in February, we'll begin another sermon series in which we will probe the

Bible's wisdom as it relates to living peaceably with all. I also plan to host a variety of seminars throughout the year that will focus on cultivating and maintaining relational health in a variety of specific contexts (i.e., marriage, parenthood, friendships, and so on).

I'm so excited to see how God will work in and through us this year!
