

PERSONALLY FROM THE PASTOR

To My Church Family,

Last spring, Krista's school purchased a church building adjacent to their campus with the intention of relocating their pre-K program there (the preschool had been meeting in a temp building). The plan was to have the space ready by the beginning of this semester, which was good news for us as we were planning to have Nate begin pre-K at the same time. The first two weeks went by without a hitch. Unfortunately, everything changed by the third week—the school had been operating under the assumption that the state had given them permission to meet in the church while renovations were being finished. This ended up not being true and pre-K had to move back to the temp building.

I'll be honest with you and tell you that I was quite annoyed by this change. It's hard enough to get three boys to school by 7:45 in the morning. The church is conveniently located right where I park to drop-off Sam and Eli, which made dropping all boys off really easy. The temp building, however, is about a five-minute walk away from the car, making the morning drop-off routine take longer than it previously had.

A few days into the change though, Paul's words from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 came to mind: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." I think God was gently convicting me that gratitude isn't dependent on my circumstances being easy, but rather a choice to see His goodness in the midst of them. Those longer walks to the temp building became unexpected gifts: extra moments to hold Nate's hand, a bit of exercise to start the day, time to drink my coffee, and chances to greet teachers and parents I might have otherwise rushed past. What I had seen as an inconvenience turned out to be an opportunity to slow down and notice God's grace woven through the ordinary.

Throughout November, our church will likewise take time to recognize and reflect on the various ways that God blesses us. We'll begin this coming by showing our appreciation to all of the volunteers who give of their time and talents in service to the church and its various ministries. Then, on Sunday November 9, we'll be showing our appreciation for all of the veterans in our church who courageously served in the military to protect our country and freedoms we enjoy Finally, on Sunday, November 16, we'll be gathering for our annual Thanksgiving meal to feast in anticipation of an even greater feast to come.

May we all strive to give God our thanks in all of our circumstances!


