To My Church Family,

I'm going to spend three weeks in October doing something that I never thought I'd do: preach and teach about politics. The fact that I'm crossing a long-standing boundary of our church—that is, we leave politics at the front door when we gather for worship—should indicate to you just how concerned I am about the upcoming election. The divisions within our country and in the Church (by this I mean the universal Church, not WCC) are substantial, and the election has the potential to make things worse. Much worse.

I also have deep concerns about the way that I have witnessed many Christians engaging in politics, namely by the way they "play" the political game using the world's rules. However, 1 Peter 2:9 reminds us that we are "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people." Among other things, this passage means that you and I are set apart from the world. Its ways are not our ways; rather, ours is the way of the Lamb. And the Lamb's way? It subverts the expectations, agenda, and methods of the world more often than not.

No, I won't tell you how to vote. Nor will I endorse a particular politician, party, or platform. Instead, I intend to help you formulate a vision of Christian political engagement that places the Lamb and His Kingdom at the center of all things.

I pray that this effort ultimately brings honor and glory to Him.


