

PERSONALLY FROM THE PASTOR

To My Church Family,

Several years ago, my niece, Ella, was in a class with a boy who told her that she was going to go to hell because her parents let her go trick-or-treating! While this boy's comment was simultaneously laughable and upsetting, I do think that it raises and important question for those of us who follow Christ; namely, "Is it appropriate for Christians to participate in Halloween-related activities?"

I believe that, as a general rule, it is fine for Christians to participate in most Halloween activities. Of course, this opinion is based largely on a personal bias. I always had very positive experiences with Halloween when I was a child. Even though I was raised in a Christian household, I was allowed to go trick-or-treating every single year. Some of my most precious memories are of those brisk Halloween nights on which I traveled with my family through our neighborhood as we hunted for that sweet, sweet loot.

For many of us, the answer feels personal. I admit that my own perspective is shaped by experience. Growing up in a Christian home, I was allowed to go trick-or-treating every year, and those evenings remain some of my sweetest childhood memories. I can still feel the cool autumn air, remember the sound of leaves crunching beneath my feet, and see my family walking together from house to house. Halloween, for me, wasn't about darkness or fear--it was about joy, family, and community.

But even setting personal memories aside, it's important to remember that many of our modern traditions are rooted not in paganism but in the Church's own story. Halloween finds its place in the larger Christian observance of Hallowmas, a three-day period that includes All Hallows' Eve (October 31), All Saints' Day (November 1), and All Souls' Day (November 2). Historically, this was a time when Christians paused to remember those who had gone before them in the faith, honoring their witness and drawing encouragement from their lives.

That may come as a surprise since there are plenty of misconceptions about Halloween. It isn't "Satan's birthday," it isn't purely pagan in origin, and it certainly isn't a ticket to eternal condemnation. In fact, the Church has long seen this season as holy: a time to reflect on God's faithfulness through the ages. And I believe it can still be holy for us today.

Halloween, when approached with wisdom and grace, can be more than costumes and candy. It can be:

- 1. A reminder that the spiritual world is real, and there is more to life than what we can see.
- 2. A sobering reminder that we are fragile, mortal people who depend fully on God.
- 3. An encouragement to look back at the countless men and women of faith who gave their lives in service to Christ's Kingdom, and to let their example strengthen our own walk.

So whether or not you choose to carve pumpkins, pass out candy, or dress up with your kids, my prayer is that this October, God would bless you through the beauty of the season, the joy of community, and the hope of His presence. And may we all remember that even in the darkest nights, the light of Christ shines bright.

"The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1).
