

## PERSONALLY FROM THE PASTOR

To My Church Family,

When you hear the word "prophet," you might immediately think of someone who has the ability to predict the future. But in the Bible, prophets are much more than fortune-tellers—they are God's messengers, sent to guide, correct, and encourage His covenant people.

Let me set the stage for you. Early in their history, the people of Israel begged God for a king (they wanted to be like the other nations, even though God set them apart to be different). God warned them that a human king would bring challenges, even oppression, but the people persisted. God eventually granted their request and made Saul the first king of Israel. There were a couple of good kings who followed Saul, but for the most part the kings of Israel were wicked men who led the people into cycles of idolatry and injustice.

The Minor Prophets were sent into these times of struggle. Their primary role was to call God's people back to Himself. They urged Israel to repent, to live justly, and to embrace their identity as a set-apart people chosen by God. Each prophet had a distinct voice and style: some were poetic, others blunt and confrontational, yet all conveyed God's heart for His people.

This fall, we'll be spending twelve weeks studying the Minor Prophets together. Don't let their name fool you though; they are called "minor" simply because they are shorter than the Major Prophets, not because they are less important than them! In this series, we'll explore themes that resonate today as much as they did thousands of years ago: faithfulness in the face of temptation and compromise, the call to live justly in community, the courage to hear hard truths and respond with repentance, and hope in restoration that comes from trusting God's promises.

We'll be reading through the Minor Prophets chronologically instead of how they are ordered in the Bible. Here's the reading schedule for the next twelve weeks (interestingly, several of these books contain prophecies about the coming of the Messiah, so this series will provide a smooth segue into Advent).
