

300th ANNIVERSARY FUN FACT

In 1773, the town voted not to build a steeple on the meeting house. In 1801, Samuel Parkman (son of Ebenezer) purchased a Paul Revere bell and brought it to Westborough. There was another vote to add a steeple, which passed. The new bell was installed in the steeple. This was the first bell that had ever called people to worship in Westborough.
