LIGHTING THE CHRIST CANDLE The Regnier Family

1st Person: Advent is a tradition often celebrated in the Christian faith to prepare for the

arrival or coming of Jesus Christ. The Advent wreath is used to symbolically

remind us of the gifts Christ brings into the world.

2nd Person: The first purple candle symbolizes HOPE. It is lit to remind us of the prophets,

particularly Isaiah, who prophesied the birth of Christ. It symbolizes the anticipation felt in awaiting the coming of the Messiah. It also represents our

hope and prayers for a world of peace and harmony.

(The first purple candle is relit)

3rd Person: The second purple candle is to remind us that Jesus is the Prince of PEACE. His

light helps us find ways to share God's peace with others.

(The second purple candle is relit.)

4th Person: The third candle, the pink one, represents JOY. As we wait for Christmas, we look

forward to the joyful celebrations we will share with others. The angels told the shepherds not to be afraid. "Good news of great joy, which shall be to all people."

(The pink candle is relit.)

5th Person: The fourth candle, reminds us of God's gift of LOVE. With this flame we signify the

love of God that surrounds us and fills us at all times.

(The purple candle is relit.)

Today we light our white candle. The CHRIST CANDLE. This candle which represents Jesus. It is the center of our wreath, just as Jesus is the center of our

lives. HAPPY BIRTHDAY, JESUS!

(The white candle is lit.)

6th Person: Let us Pray: **God, our hearts sing with joy and praise because of Jesus. At this**

happy season, we rejoice that Jesus came among us. By his birth and life, He has shown us that we are Your people and that we are greatly loved. Help us to remember this Christmas all year long by giving to others the gifts of Life: hope,

peace, joy, love, kindness and understanding. Amen.
