In 1982 the annual "Adopt a Child" Christmas gift mission project was established by Gretchen Helm, wife of Pastor Norman Helm. In 1987, a Feed-a-Friend program was established to furnish food for hungry families in Worcester. We continue to donate food to places such as Prospect House, INH, and Westborough Food Pantry. Also in 1987, our church held its first Coat Drive, collecting 400 coats for those in shelters in Boston and Worcester, and we sponsored the Heifer Project to help farmers in developing countries become self-sufficient.
