A Message from Rev. Betsy...

Jesus said to them, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." MT 28:19-20

This past June I was officially installed as your pastor and teacher. A role I take very seriously. A pastor is responsible for planning their own installation service, starting with a theme, then choosing a preacher, two ministers to give charges — one to the pastor and one to the congregation, and music. This time of preparation is very important because the theme of your installation service reflects the theme you hope your time of ministry will reflect. The theme for my service was "Our Ministry Together." This theme acknowledges our partnership with the other churches in our Association as well as our covenant with the Conference and wider UCC. We work within our Association on special mission projects, sending help when disaster strikes a church within our Association, and sometimes doing programs together, like the shared interfaith portion of our Confirmation program for which we'll be joining the Grafton Church Confirmation program. We minister with the Conference by accepting leadership, recommendations, and enrichment programs and taking part in local mission projects. Most importantly, we minister together within our local church through worship, our Called to Care visitation program, our fellowship time, and our mission programs and Christian Education programs. Yes, I am your pastor and teacher. I can lead by my example, inspire by my preaching, open eyes, hearts, and minds by my teaching, but the ministry Jesus calls The Congregational Church of Westborough to do, is more than one person can accomplish and is meant for us all. Working together, each with our own gifts, perspectives, community connections, and inspiration, we accomplish so much in the building of God's Kingdom on earth.

Cabinet Comments

This will be the first of a monthly summary of notes from Cabinet. We want to be sure that our congregation is aware of the major points in each meeting and all are well informed about what's happening. Sometimes things mentioned here will also be reported elsewhere, but we believe that being "overinformed" is better than being "uninformed". As you can imagine, some meetings will have more substance, and others less so. Also, these summaries, due to timing, will provide insights into the previous month's meetings—so this first summary will reflect the July 19th meeting. Please let me know what you think and if you have any suggestions to make these summaries more informative.

As a reminder, the cabinet consists of elected officers of the church, heads of boards and certain committees, as well as three "At-Large" members. In next month's Comments, I'll include a list of Cabinet member names. You should always feel free to speak to any Cabinet member about church-related activities—the Cabinet exists to represent you and ensure that your voice is heard!

July 19th Bullet Points:

- A prayer Vigil was held in the church for healing for Brenda Lord as she underwent another brain surgery. The Vigil was led by Rev. Betsy and Clif Newton, Pastor
- Rev Betsy is working to set up a parents meeting for youth who are ready for Confirmation. A curriculum has been selected and students will pick their mentors. Sign up will be September 10th and an opening dinner date will be established.
- Financially, we continue to track with a slight surplus, and are very grateful to all for their donations, for meeting their pledges, and making gifts to the church.
- Rev. Betsy will be moving into the second floor of our property at 7 Church St. A lot of work has gone into converting the space into a residential apartment from an office. Due to Rev. Betsy's mobility issues, stair lifts have been installed. Also, Rev. Betsy is looking for a China cabinet.
- A shed will be built and placed on the church parking lot to house lawn and other maintenance equipment so the garage can be emptied and used for a car.
- The tech team is looking for feedback on the audio/video that has been installed in the Chapel. Please let Tom Morgan know if you have any comments.
- We're grateful that Jack Glennon and others worked to get mini-splits installed in the chapel for both AC and heat.
- The Cabinet unanimously approved to add Dana Crawford to the Board of Trustees. For the time being, the Trustees will be utilizing a rotating chair. As always, we are looking for diverse representation on this important board, so please see Dave Smith if you are interested or if you have a suggestion.
- Missions Board is looking for volunteers to make dinner at Dismas House in Q3 and Q4, which occurs on the 4th Tuesday of each month. Please talk to Pam Faustineif you can help.
- A reminder, as noted earlier, WELCOME HERE SUNDAY is September 10th, featuring a picnic right after worship and Sunday School signups.

REV. BETSY'S INSTALLATION

Sunday, June 4th, 2023 was an exciting day in the life and history of The Congregational Church of Westborough. On that day, we installed the Reverend Elizabeth (Betsy) Dorsi as our 26th settled pastor – the first woman ever to hold that position in our church. It was a service filled with music, prayers, and praise, followed by a delicious meal in the vestry.

During the installation, we formed a three-way covenant, between Reverend Betsy, our congregation, and The Central Massachusetts
Association of the United Church of Christ.
Installation is the action of an association of the United Church of Christ in cooperation with a local church. Installation confirms and celebrates the covenantal relationship among a local church, its pastor and teacher, and the United Church of Christ. Installation is a sign that these covenantal partners are committed to share mutually in the mission of the United Church of Christ and of the ecumenical church.

The service included music from our Chancel Choir, a duet by two youth members, four hymns which are special to Rev. Dorsi, and a special bell piece. The bell piece is an original composition commissioned by the Festival Ringers in 1997 to celebrate their 20th anniversary. Members representing various areas of our church participated in the service, as well as two pastors from local UCC churches, a member of the Westborough Interfaith Clergy group, and representatives from the MA Conference. The sermon was given by the pastor of Reverend Betsy's former church in Connecticut.

Afterwards, we enjoyed a meal that was catered by John Ayotte, of Chef du Jour, and it was delicious. Thank you to the Deacons for organizing the collation! Leftover food was delivered to homeless families living in one of the hotels in town.

Prior to the start of the service, a special video created by Tom Morgan was shown – highlighting the various women who have served our congregation as interim ministers, associate pastors, and students. Plans are in the works for the video of the entire service to be shown again on Westborough TV...stay tuned for notice of when that's happening!

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER

As of the end of July 2023, pledges collected are at \$146,662 or 63% of our budget (with only 60% of the year gone by!) and \$11,153 more than what was collected at this time last year. A big thank you to all who continue to faithfully fulfill their pledge, even during the slow summer months! Your continued support of our church is greatly appreciated.

BIG IDEA MISSION PROJECT: MEALS FOR UKRAINE!

Sunday, June 11th was a BIG day at our church! Following a Sunday School year-end picnic, 90 volunteers gathered in the vestry to pack meals for Ukraine. Young and old alike participated in the setup and cleanup, with lots of assembly-line work in between. In a little under 2 hours, we packed 12,858 meals which were sent to Ukraine this summer. Matthew from Outreach.org was stunned at how quickly we accomplished all this. Many thanks to the members and friends & family of our church who participated, along with members of Westborough High School's National Honor Society, and folks from Congregation B'nai Shalom. These meals will make a big difference in the lives of those receiving them.











OTHER MISSION UPDATES:

In the Hour of Need Family Shelter - We were able to fill most dinner and overnight spots during our week of hosting in July. It was good to see that three of the families who were at the shelter in March had moved out to permanent housing. The children at IHN were able to go to summer camp this year and the families and staff really appreciated our help.

PROPERTIES

7 Church Street Garage Storage

The photo below shows the equipment that the Properties Committee has stored in the left-side garage at 7 Church for the last many years. In order to maximize the rental potential for the second-floor apartment, it was deemed necessary to find another storage space. To that end, it was decided to purchase a 10-foot by 12-foot shed kit which will accommodate the ride-on lawnmower, the barbecue grill, the snowblower and the battery-operated push mower. Other items, such as hoses and bags of lawn lime can also be accommodated in the shed, which will be locked.



THE STORAGE SHED

Once the decision was made to utilize the secondfloor unit at 7 Church St. as a residence, it became obvious that the garage, with its direct access to the second floor, would be a critical component to garner the highest rent for the apartment. Hence, the Trustees and the Properties Committee set out to find alternate storage for the large items that are stored in the garage, namely the ride-on lawnmower, the snowblower, the barbecue, the electric push mower and the popcorn machine. It was decided to purchase and assemble a 10-foot by 12-foot, wooden shed for this purpose since wooden sheds are wind-rated whereas metal ones are not. In order to locate the shed in the least conspicuous location, it was decided to put it in the parking lot near the north side of the office. This location will not impede the installation of a handicap ramp if one is installed in the future.

Over the past few months, the components for the shed—four, 4 X 4 X 10 base supports, the two base

assemblies, the 4 walls, the shed floor and the 5 roof rafters, were preassembled and on Saturday, August 12, a group of six dedicated, talented workers put the 4 walls, the roof rafters, the roof sheathing and the doors together to produce the shed shown in the picture above. Master Electrician Brett Borglund brought power to the shed for lighting and a 110-volt receptacle. The blue tarp pictured above is to protect the roof until the shingles are installed.

As it turned out, Reverend Betsy decided to move into the second-floor apartment, which was accomplished on August 8. Some finishing work on the shed is proceeding, but it is now able to accept the large items for storage. A hearty "thank you" to Brett Borglund, Jack and Cam Glennon, Mike Lawler, Ted Jaworski, Roland and Paul Regnier and Dave Smith for their dedication to and time spent on this endeavor.

GROCERY GIFT CARDS

Grocery Gift Cards 2003 – 2023

<u>History</u>: In 2003 Steve Achorn, Nancy Quimby, and Doug Wales were instrumental in bringing the grocery gift card fundraiser to our Church. This program took off and over the years brought thousands of dollars to support our operation budget. In one peak year this program realized a profit of \$14,000. Perhaps you were the one who used grocery gift cards to go to Stop and Shop where you purchased Lowe's gift cards to buy a new refrigerator. Or maybe you used grocery gift cards to purchase Best Buy cards and bought a new computer. And many of us used grocery gift cards to purchase other gift cards at Stop and Shop to fulfill the wishes of little ones on the Christmas Giving Tree.

Times have changed! No longer do many folks have a checkbook in their pocket to buy grocery cards after Church. No longer do most folks buy their groceries at just Stop and Shop or Roche Bros. And no longer does the Grocery Card Team pick up the gift cards at Stop and Shop. Those gift cards are ordered through a distribution center in North Carolina who then sends them to the Church office where we must then activate them before adding them to inventory. We've struggled over the last couple of years to reach our goal of \$4,000. for the Church budget. Sometimes all good things come to an end. After much thought and consideration, the Grocery Card Team has decided to end this fundraiser. We still have many cards in inventory. We will continue to sell until that is depleted. We'll count on you to help us accomplish this. However, we will not be ordering any new cards. Many, many thanks to all who have supported this program. We will miss chatting with you after Church or delivering cards to your home.
