







## PASTORAL SEARCH UPDATE

In an effort to keep the Congregation up-to-date about the Progress of the Pastoral Search Committee, we are trying multiple modes of communication to reach our members and friends. As a congregation we are a diversely located population! We have made announcements at Sunday Services, have spoken at all-church meetings (budget meetings and others), updated the Cabinet monthly, set up a tables at Coffee Hour, used the Sunday Bulletin, spoken from the pulpit, and now the Evangel and eNews Updates. Here's our update:

In early March, your Search Committee finished up our 40 page Local Church Profile and sent it to the UCC Conference where it was reviewed and published to interested ministers via conference staff and the UCC Website.

While we were doing our work, of course, the Coronavirus was ramping up its attack on the United States and the world. This virus affects how we do our work. It looks like ZOOM has become our friend! Both for our committee and for our candidate ministers.

Our team took a short break, and consulted with our Associate Conference Minister about our next steps. As noted above, our job opening is now live on the UCC website and is being viewed by prospective candidates. We expect that candidate ministers' profiles will begin to come to us via the Conference. Our team, in the meantime begins preparing for interviews by creating the set of questions we plan to ask each candidate, organizing for the interview and due diligence process, holding a mock interview to practice interview skills, and reading profiles. We will be busy! It's the time when our local church Profile begins to give us results. We have felt your care and best wishes. Thank you for your prayers on our behalf.

This next phase is, of course, a time of confidentiality but we want to continue to communicate our progress to you. Please let us know your suggestions as to how best to communicate with you.

Also Jim and Lisa's daughter Emily and some of her friends are making phone calls a couple times a week to check in with the elderly buddies they have been paired with. This is a great way to get your teenagers involved and it really makes a difference to those that are alone.*



### **Let's Bring Workcamp To Westborough In 2021**

Hi Everyone! Many of you have reached out asking for an update on our Team's progress towards hosting a Group Missions Workcamp here in July of 2021. Thank you for your continued support. We did not get the news we were hoping for from the Westborough Public Schools. They are not able to partner with us at this time and do not have space available to house our campers in July of 2021 or anytime soon. While we were disappointed, we were not defeated. The journey to host a Workcamp is a marathon, not a sprint, and at the

outset we were warned that there would be MANY hurdles and roadblocks along the way. Our next step was to reach out to as many different schools as possible. We made a list of other public school systems, private schools, even colleges and universities in the area and began to compile contact information for key individuals to connect with. And then...CoronaVirus arrived. There isn't a school anywhere that has time to focus on anything other than providing remote learning for students and keeping them safe.

There certainly isn't a school anywhere interested right now in even the thought of hosting 300+ campers from all over the country. So for now, we are on hold. May 1st was the original deadline to confirm our partnership with Group Missions and to begin advertising our Camp for 2021. As you can imagine, their focus right now is on managing 2020 trips. The last email from Group has our trip to Waverly, NY scheduled to take place as planned June 27th-July 4th, but it is hard to imagine it will actually happen. If the camps planned from this summer can't be held, I don't know if they will be postponed until 2021 or what that would mean for our plans. It's simply too early to tell. What I DO know is that I can't help but see God at work. Workcamps may never be the same as much of our world will never be the same. There will be devastating losses and many disappointments, but there will also be great changes in perspective and positive growth. There will be different needs emerging in different areas and different people coming forward to offer their gifts. I hope you will continue along this journey with us and I hope you will join me in praying that His light will ultimately shine brightly on the path He has imagined for us so that we may serve together along wherever that path may lead. **Food Pantry** – (Update from Polly Thayer)

In our ongoing effort to keep you all informed, here's our latest plans, remembering this is an ever-evolving world we are living in!

We have decided to keep the Food Pantry doors closed until at least May 5, coinciding with the reopening of public schools across the state.

\* The community has been overwhelmingly generous to the Food Pantry - we have received about \$12,000 in monetary donations and several thousand dollars' worth of grocery gift cards to date.

We are still in need of grocery card donations and monetary donations. Donations may be dropped off in the black box in front of the Town Hall, there's a Food Pantry lock box at the Fire Station, and US Mail is always good - Westborough Food Pantry, PO Box 502, Westborough, MA 01581. Please pass this information along to others.

We hope that you are well and stay healthy. You are the best group of volunteers!

**IHN** - Just wanted to update you on our week at IHN and where they are at during this crisis. We were fortunate enough to have all shifts covered. Only a couple people had to cancel due to their own illness or concerns over contracting COVID-19 due to their own health. I was able to get coverage for those shifts and someone has been there for every shift. Thank you to all those who volunteered and donated grocery cards. All is greatly appreciated! I have included a letter from Joanne Alley, the interim director of IHN. I did not include the attachments she speaks of but it includes precautions such as cleaning 3X/day especially door handles, staying in your room if you have a cough, fever or are just feeling unwell. Hi All,

*As we navigate these uncertain times I want to update you on what's happening at IHN, what our needs are and to let you to know what policies have put into place for our families and everyone entering IHN. Attached is FH's plan for their shelters (of which we are one) re: COVID-19 and the procedures put in place at IHN in response to the virus. Please read them and feel free to share them with all of your volunteers. They are also posted at the house.*

*To update you on staff: Most of you know Bruce and the many serious health issues he is dealing with. He has made the wise decision to not come back to work until the pandemic has passed and it is safe for him to do so. We are working on a plan to keep the house covered and we're asking anyone willing to help cover any time on Saturdays (our most pressing need) or to be on call as needed for evenings and overnights to please contact me so you can be added to our list.*

*We are also asking for help with supplies. Our most pressing need is for disinfectant spray and disinfectant wipes, as well as bleach and cleaning products that disinfect, hand soap, paper towels and baby wipes. Other items needed, but not as urgently: toilet paper, tissues, laundry detergent, gloves and masks. (It's doubtful that masks are available, but we left them on the list because they are a need.) My hope is that we may be able to get a can of disinfectant from someone, a tub of disinfectant wipes or some soap from someone else. If everyone can donate one of these items it would be a huge help in keeping the house as healthy as possible and getting us through this difficult time. With the children out of school, we are also asking for donations of juice and water, and help restocking our cabinets with foods such as pasta, sauce, rice, mac & cheese, canned goods.*

*More information will follow as things come in, change or if any policies need to be added or adjusted. Please let me know if anyone is willing to help in any way at all or able to donate any supplies. Thank you for this and for all you do for IHN! -Joanne*

### As our Challenge comes to an end...

Our hope is that after **40 Days & 40 Nights** - a long enough time to have a lasting impact personally - as guided by our faith, we will feel compelled to continue on this journey and to share these easy lifestyle changes with others. Creating... The Ripple Effect! Small steps, major impact. We have learned so much together over the weeks. To help you keep up with your lifestyle changes and encourage you to learn and do more, here are some startling STATS to remember moving forward:

- Over 8.3 billion tons of plastic has been made since its mass production began in the 1950s.

- Only 9% of this plastic has been recycled, the other 91% sits in landfills or floats in our oceans.
- An estimated 8 million tons of plastic enters the ocean every year.
- Over 1 million plastic bottles are purchased every minute around the world.
- For the recommended amount of eight glasses of water a day, bottled water costs: \$1,800 a year/person!
- Nearly two million plastic bags are produced every minute!
- On average, plastic bags are used for a few minutes then thrown 'away'.
- Each day, more than 500 million plastic straws are used and discarded in the United States alone!
- A 2017 study found that up to 8.3 billion plastic straws pollute the world's coastlines today.
- Around 500 billion disposable coffee cups are produced each year. Paper and cardboard coffee cups have a thin plastic lining to prevent liquids leaking, making them difficult to recycle.

Yes, these STATS are startling BUT we now know they are not insurmountable. Each one of us has the power to change how we live, work and play. Each one of us has the power to share what we have learned. How we live matters. Let's live for God's Glory, let's care for creation. Each one of us must believe: "Let it begin with me."





