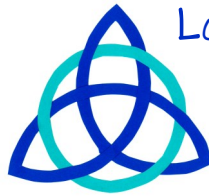

Arstein Update:
Howdy and Happy New Year from cold and freezing Texas

We had another 17-degree night last night. We didn't have the fifty mile an hour wind today, that made walking the dog colder than skiing in subzero weather.

We have three houses being built on our street and it took the builders three days to frame the houses. Incredibly fast workers. There obviously are no union rules because they work morning til dark, seven days a week. They did take Christmas Day off, but some showed up to check their measurements.

Our house is very tight and the workers' Mexican music is relatively soft from inside the house. The garage has no windows, and has no light leaks. I was used to my Camarillo garage that had windows in the garage door, and several times I got completely lost when I turned the lights off before opening the door into house.

Tena and I are now completely Texans. We got our Texas license plates and our Texas drivers license today. They took our California Driver's license away from us, and I feel like I have lost my identity.

We have three functioning beds and three functioning bathrooms, all we need to take care of guests. Our new dining table and chairs are coming in tomorrow. Our couch is not going to be here until January 28th, much to Tena's chagrin; we have not ordered our third bedroom furniture, but Tad and Kathy have a favorite kind of bed which they ordered for them to use when they helped us move in. The kitchen is very functional and we are slowly filling up our new refrigerator.

The major problem we have now, is Barney has no easy way to get to the outside to take care of business. We had left him in the house this morning while we got our driver's licenses, and he rewarded us with a terrible smell when we got home. The first time since he was a baby that he had a mess in the house.

We have heard that Southern California is facing another huge possibility of a catastrophic wind storm. Fires are always a possibility when the winds are blowing. Camarillo suffered mightily with the last big blow.

We are facing the probability of snow tomorrow. They say the area will be shut down. The bible studies that we were scheduled to attend have been cancelled. The danger, apparently, is ice on the road. Shawn said that the Texas drivers were way worse than California drivers in the white stuff.

The last month has been filled with miracle accomplishments and some overwhelming challenges for me. Tad and Shawn pulled off the move itself like pros and Kathy joined them in steering the moving in and adjusting. Don hasn't missed a beat in all the myriad of business, medical, financial and legal changes required and driving all over Fort Worth to get us functioning.

The house is lovely, especially the kitchen - we are fully functioning there even though my meal-planning skills disappeared in two months of not cooking. Our new dining table and chairs have now arrived. We can seat ten, maybe 12 for family dinners and guests! Our denim-look sectional with chaise is scheduled for January 28. We are wearing out our 2 Lazy-Boy recliners and 2 rattan chairs.

Church services have been welcoming and people are friendly even in the GIANT grocery stores! Barney has two puppies in the family he loves and two great-granddaughters who are loving him.

Only now am I letting myself think about Camarillo very much. Reality is slow in setting in. I believe God was clear in His call to come, but I am slow to comprehend it all. I welcome your prayers for me to joyfully embrace every precious moment and person that God blesses us with each and every new day!!!

You are all so special in our lives and we treasure our connections. Let's keep in touch frequently!!! ...and PLEASE come visit us!

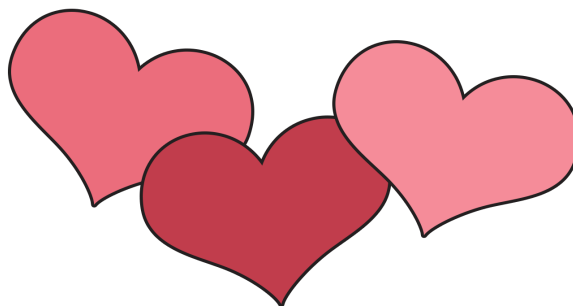

Sap, Syrup, and Servanthood

February in New England is the month when winter snows typically start to retreat. The warm rays of the sun begin to coax strains of sugar-laden sap up the vascular system within maple trees. While any evidence of colorful fall leaves have long-since vanished, and ski slopes begin to lose their luster, another excitement abounds. Prospects arise for a healthy new season producing gallons of delicious maple syrup.

The conditions under which sap must flow require that sap freezes during the night hours. Then, as the day warms up, the tree begins to act like a pump, setting sap in motion to flow up the tree. Tubes are plugged into the trees, where the sap seeps out, beginning its journey to awaiting sap trucks, which will offload their treasure at a sugar farm. There this frothy, uncomely substance will be processed into the final product. Since the sap is mostly water, it must travel through a labyrinthine system of heated metal channels, causing most of the water to evaporate. It takes approximately 40 gallons of sap to produce one gallon of syrup.

It should become obvious that much is involved to appreciate and enjoy the many benefits of this tasteful delight. Significant effort and time lie behind making maple syrup and all its associative products.

The growing believer can find a parallel in the transformation of sap into a delicious and useful product. As a child of God, and in the process of reaching a maturity in Him, we may expect to travel through the heat of uncomfortable circumstances: losing a loved one, having to evacuate a home threatened by devastating fires, being faced with a move we do not want to make, and the list goes on.

Those are precisely the times when our Comforter, our Counselor, the Holy Spirit goes to work as our dependable “delivery system”. If anyone knows and understands our plight, He does. We are in a refining process. While there may be twists and turns and difficult challenges,

God is there to help keep us focused. It is a constant quest to see us mature in servanthood, and the obedient child of God is rewarded with the ‘flavor’ of His grace. King David said it the best: “Taste and see that the Lord is good.”
