

FIRE: friend, foe, or infliction?

Forgive me for reaching into my sordid past. One of my favorite boyhood memories was watching a marshmallow get scorched as it dangled atop a repurposed hanger over a warm bonfire in the orchard behind my Grandma's Yucaipa homestead. This family event normally marked the dénouement to a marvelous afternoon beginning with a handful of us cousins rollicking over bales of hay in Grandpa's barn. The capstone lay in devouring a cornucopia of food which was spread over the rear of the buckboard wagon. The finale of the evening was consuming homemade ice cream churned in the White Mountain bucket, and hand-cranked by every red-blooded male in the family.

That was another era. Not now. This fondness for fire has been virtually buried. Our current attention has been skewed by reports of blaze after blaze erupting over populated communities, businesses, and onto global conflagrations.

Biblical records demonstrate that God has used the elements of His creation to administer justice. Early in Scripture we are told that because "The Lord saw how great man's wickedness on the earth had become, and that every inclination of his heart was only evil all the time", God unloaded His wrath upon the earth and covered it with water worldwide, to the point that "every living thing on earth perished..." After the earth was restored, and mankind began to proliferate, we find incident upon incident where man returns to his former corrupt ways. At this juncture, God frequently uses fire to get man's attention.

Take, for instance, the case of God's judgment when He rained down burning sulfur on the depravity of Sodom and Gomorrah. To this day, you can still stumble around large pieces of brimstone rubble on the plains of Zoar. Then who can forget the account of the prophet Elijah at Mount Carmel, getting the last laugh over 450 prophets of Baal as "the fire of the Lord fell and burned up the sacrifice, the stones and the soil, and also licked up the water in the trench."

During these current times, our adversary Satan especially enjoys searing our collective conscience with anxiety and fear. Authorities all over our county, state, and nation constantly urge us to be ready! It is true that we certainly should not neglect the importance of preparedness. However, there is one fire that the apostle Paul insisted we encourage: "Do not put

out the Spirit's fire! Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you!"
