

From the Pastor's Desk



I am writing my article for the Trinity Times this month as I sit next to my Mother-in-law in her hospital room. It has been over 21 days since she fell and broke her hip. Before being released from rehab, an ulcer began bleeding excessively. The only remedy was to do a medical procedure to stop the bleeding. During this procedure, the physician perforated a bowel and things got very serious. I have come to learn that a perforated bowel is a severe medical emergency where a hole forms in the intestinal wall, allowing digestive contents to leak into the abdomen, causing widespread infection. Because of her age, the tissue that had been perforated takes a long time, if ever, to heal. Sherry and I can't thank you enough for all your love, prayers and support these few weeks. We have truly felt them.

As I mentioned in one of my recent sermons, this event has helped me see the importance of hiding God's word in your heart. You never know when you will need to draw on God's promises. Psalm 119:11 says "*I've banked your promises in the vault of my heart.*" When we keep God's word in our hearts we can make withdraws when needed. What a blessing it was sharing God's word with Jackie each day.

As this article hits the streets, I will be back in Atlanta for our annual denominational meetings. When I return we will be holding our Congregational meeting on February 8th. At the meeting we will go over the 2026 budget, provide committee reports, and elect Elders and Deacons as well as this years nominating committee.

Continue to pray with me that we will be used by God to tell others of the night and day difference Jesus has made in our lives.


2026 Annual Congregational Meeting

“Beginning the year with Babel babble

As we now have stepped over the threshold of a new year, we will face a whole fresh set of challenges. No question about it. I am always amused by that column in the VC STAR, page two of the New Years Day edition, which wistfully informs us, “there are 359 days left in the year.” In truth, there will be set after set of new beginnings.

New beginnings. Is there any other document that better describes what happened at the outset of time than Genesis 1: 1 – “In the beginning, God created,..”? Or foretold the arrival of God in the flesh, John 1: 1 – “In the beginning was the Word,..”? The noun “word”, in the ancient Greek lexicon, has been translated as “logos.” In his book “The Body,” John Colson says that the Greeks believed its meaning “embraced what we would call intelligence, reason, and truth – that which is embodied in the very plan of creation itself.”

Words. We are *obliged* to employ them, whether they are spoken, written, printed, texted, or silently conveyed by hand-signs. Even so-called body language is insufficient to fully describe a full spectrum of meanings behind words.

Words, of course, are essential elements of language. Early in Scripture, Genesis 11, we are told that the entire world had only one language, a common speech. At one point people converged on a Mesopotamian plain. There they decided to build an enormous tower, intending to “reach into the heavens, and make a name for themselves.” At the outset of this effort, God descended on their action, scrambled their language, and scattered them abroad over the earth. It was called Babel, a word meaning *confusion*. Communication went into chaos around the world. That happened approximately 400 centuries ago. Today, we are informed by Wycliffe Bible Translators that, spread throughout 173 countries over the globe, there are a shade over 5,000 languages spoken.

Does any of this sound intimidating to you as we enter the New Year? We are constantly pummeled over the media and assaulted on social platforms. How do we sift through a language to find *words* we can trust? Why not start with words from the mouth of Jesus, the Alpha and Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End, when he said to the Father, “Your *word* is truth.”

Sure beats Babel babble.
