A NOTE FROM JOSH...

Church Family,

I hope you've been encouraged and challenged by our current sermon series in the book of Acts. Week after week, we're watching the early church come alive—and we're reminded that the same Spirit who moved in power in Acts is still at work in and through us today. My prayer is that this series continues to grow your boldness, deepen your faith, and inspire your obedience to Jesus.

There's a lot happening at Cornerstone this summer, and I want to invite you to be part of it through your prayers, encouragement, and involvement.

First, please be praying for our **two mission teams** heading out this month—one to **Honduras**, and one to **Spruce Pine, North Carolina**. These teams are going out as the hands and feet of Jesus, serving people, building relationships, and sharing the hope of the gospel. Pray for safety, unity, and for hearts to be open to the message of Jesus. Pray for the Holy Spirit to do what only He can do.

Also this month, our **kids and students are heading to camp!** These camp experiences are more than just fun and games—they're often turning points in a young person's spiritual life. Pray that our kids and students hear God's voice clearly, respond to Him in faith, and come back encouraged and changed.

And speaking of the next generation—thank you to everyone who gave, served, and prayed to make Vacation Bible School such a powerful week back in June. We had the joy of sharing the gospel with upwards of 90 kids, and we watched Jesus work in real and powerful ways, including multiple salvations! Let's keep praying that those gospel seeds grow deep roots in the lives of these children and their families.

Lastly, I'm excited to let you know that we've officially launched the **design phase for our new worship center**. This is a major step forward after a long season of prayer and preparation. Please keep this in your prayers—pray for clarity, wisdom, and a unified spirit as the details come together. We anticipate **breaking ground later this year**, and we're trusting God to use this space to expand His work through Cornerstone for decades to come.

I love what Jesus is doing in and through our church. Let's keep following him together—because the story Jesus is writing in and through Cornerstone isn't nearly finished.

Throughout the week they will do ministry with a construction project, conducting VBS at schools, worshipping with Honduran believers to encourage them, and delivering food supplies to those in need.

Spruce Pine (July 11-12): As I write this article, we are still confirming the size of our Spruce Pine team, and it looks like it will be larger than our Honduras Team. Pray for our adults and children who plan to go to the mountains of Western NC and conduct a one-day VBS Outreach for Western Carolina Church. Spruce Pine was one of the areas hit hardest by Hurricane Helene. We need to encourage this gospel-based church and many families in their community need the hope they can offer! **Please plan to attend our morning worship services July 20 & 27 because you'll hear the answer to your prayers. Our services will include Mission Team testimonies!**



August 3rd - Starting Point is how we invite church attenders to become church family!

"For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in

the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe." Ephesians 1:15–19

This prayer was written by Paul, and it is just one example of how he typically prayed for those he loved. His greatest desire was for them to grow in their knowledge of God and experience a deeper relationship with Him.

In his book on prayer, Tim Keller points out, "It is remarkable that in all of his writings Paul's prayers for his friends contain no appeals for changes in their circumstances. It is certain that they lived in the midst of many dangers and hardships. They faced persecution, death from disease, oppression by powerful forces, and separation from loved ones. Their existence was far less secure than ours is today. Yet in these prayers you see not one petition for a better emperor, for protection from marauding armies, or even

Keller goes on to say that it would not have been wrong for Paul to pray for such things. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus instructed us to ask for our "daily bread" and to "deliver us from evil." So what should we take away from Paul's prayers?

for bread for the next meal."

Paul's prayers reveal his deepest desire for his friends—not for their circumstances to change, but for them to know God more fully.

How should this change the way that we pray for ourselves, our family and our friends?

We should still ask God to heal and

provide and rescue. But we should make it a priority to pray for ourselves and for those we love to grow in their knowledge of God and experience a deeper relationship with Him. Trusting that God is working through our difficult circumstances to draw us closer to Him!

Most of us can quote Romans 8:28, "We know that all things work together for the good of those who love God, who are called according to His purpose." But verse 29 tells us how God will do that, "By conforming us into the image of His Son." God is using all of our circumstances, good and bad to shape us to be more like Jesus.

As we celebrate the 4th of July - Independence Day - keep in mind that there is a






