

Family Spotlight

Allen & Christine Mastin



Allen and I have only been married for 10 and a half years, so we both have long life stories from before we met.

CHRISTINE: For most of my childhood, my father was in the Navy, so each of my three siblings and I were all born in different parts and even outside of the United States. When I was in high school, after my father retired from the service, our family moved to Central PA where my father and mother were from. We moved from Virginia Beach to the middle of nowhere. We thought our lives were over...culture shock for sure. But for any families and youth going through something like this, just remember, all you need is a new best friend and all is well again, no matter where you live. Sometime later I met a wonderful young man named Jeff and in time we married.

We were young so we didn't want children right away. After six years we decided to have our first child. Unfortunately, it took another five years and a lot of anxiety before we would have our only child, a son, named Kellen. It was like God said, "You thought you were in control, but I was". After 23 years of a blessed marriage, Jeff contracted spontaneous ALS. Not good! This diagnosis took Jeff, me, our son, family and friends through a two-year journey which was heart wrenching, but full of blessings at the same time.

While Jeff's body was dying, his mind was surprisingly at peace with it all (except for knowing that he will no longer be there for Kellen and me). He was a much stronger and mature Christian than I was at that time. Seeing how he went through all of this with a "peace that passes all understanding," made me want what he had.

After his passing, I started devoting much of my time working on digging deeper into God's Word and Bible teachings. After some time, people around me started telling me that they felt that I had a calling to the ministry on my life. I wasn't convinced but after time I started to feel it for myself. I started through the process to become a licensed local pastor in the UMC, and all it took was giving up the

month of July for ten years of traveling to Washington D. C. for seminary classes, ha ha! If you had known me at that time in my life, you would not have believed that I would have done any of that. But when you receive a calling on your life, you find yourself doing what you never thought you would. So, I went on to be a minister and with that some big changes came into my life. With my second assignment I had to sell our home and move to southern PA. By then my son was out of college and I was able to go. My life could not have been any more different at that time than I had been used to. With my third assignment I was moved all the way north in PA to the PA-NY border to run five churches, REALLY GOD! It was very challenging to say the least but also rewarding. This was when I met Allen.

<u>ALLEN:</u> Allen was born and raised in the small farm town of Ulysses, PA. He was the oldest of four children and has always been thankful for being raised on a farm. Early on he enjoyed joining his father for hunting and fishing. In high school he was fortunate to participate in soccer, basketball and track. He also played parts in his junior and senior class plays. After graduation he joined the Air Force and got to see some of our country and the world. Once out of the service, his career was in financial services. He got married and had two sons. In time his marriage ended, and it was years later that he met Christine. He was actually one of her parishioners at the time. After he showed some interest in her, which was more than just pastorparishioner relationship, Christine had to sit him down and explain how and why a minister cannot form a relationship such as this with a parishioner.
