A Note from Pastor Nathan

COMFORT from the CRADLE, CROSS, CROWN, and CAMPAIGNS

Looking for some comfort or encouragement this Christmas season of Advent? Try spending time in Isaiah's chapter 40 while thinking about the details below of our financial campaigns!



As I read Isaiah 40, I hear various portions of Handel's classical music oratorio "Messiah" ringing in my ears such as the tenor solo, "COMFORT YE MY PEOPLE, saith your God!" Handel was reminding us that the prophet Isaiah had declared that the birth of God's Son Jesus would bring comfort to those who trust in the Lord – for now God is truly WITH us. He's here. One of us. He understands. He's who Paul later called the "Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God."

As you read Isaiah 40 you might also be reminded of the cross of Jesus, upon which Jesus hung and died so that "...sin has been paid for." (Is. 40:2) HE did it for us! Then as we continue in the chapter and get down to verses 22 and 23 we read of the power and majesty of the Lord who: "sits enthroned above the circle of the earth... stretches out the heavens like a canopy, and spreads them out like a tent..."

and "...reduces the rulers of this world to nothing" (vv. 22-23). Jesus as the resurrected one who wears The Crown is the one who can help us overcome anything that comes against us!

And just when you think this chapter couldn't pack any more encouragement into it, we read those famous words of the Isaiah: "Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint!" (40:30-31) WOW! Friends, that is some powerful strength we can receive from the Lord!

Here's where I get even more excited: as I read Isaiah 40 this Advent, I realize that for the most part it *reminds* me of things I *already* know because--praise the Lord--The *Church* – the children of God – *taught me these things*! And now, this Fall we just concluded two financial stewardship campaigns that support our ability as a church to help future generations to know these truths of Scripture!

In our strong Annual Stewardship Campaign for 2026, we have *exceeded* last year's pledge amount AND had more than two-dozen more pledges than last year; and in the SERVE Capital Campaign our pledges *exceeded* 2 ½ times our annual stewardship pledges, which in the church campaign world is an indication that you all are *incredibly* generous to the Lord! (1x is ok; 2x is good; 2.5+ is *GREAT*!) May you be comforted and encouraged this Advent with *all* Jesus has done in the past for you, is doing now through our church, and will be doing in our future! 

Meet Scott & Loretta Weeks

Scott's parents are Judy & Harry Weeks were from Plain City. His father passed away many years ago, but his mother still lives there with Scott's brother Andy. He also has a sister, Janet Johnston of Plain City. Loretta's Parents – Jerry & Mary Young from Marysville, are both deceased as is her sister, Louise. Scott grew up in Plain City and attended Jonathan Alder HS; Loretta grew up between Raymond and Broadway and attended MHS.

We were both farm kids, and both participated in high school sports – Scott played baseball and basketball, Loretta played softball and volleyball. We were both very involved in the FFA and earned our State Farmer Degrees. We were pretty sure we would be farming in our adult lives! Scott grew up on a large grain farm and Loretta grew up on a smaller livestock farm. We officially stopped farming around 2013 when the growth of our plumbing company left no time for it. Although Loretta begs Scott at least once a month for cows!

We just celebrated our 41st anniversary on November 10th, 2025. We met at the Plain City Barn Dance for those who remember it. Scott's favorite verse is Philippians 4:13 – "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me". He said that when he must make hard decisions or when life is stressful, this is what comes to his mind.
