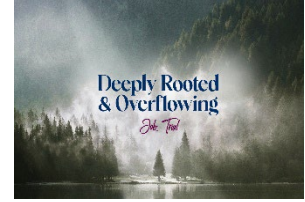

<p>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with <u>Prayer</u> -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>Read the Text</u> – Job 3-37 (whole or parts)</p> <p><u>Questions for Reflection & Discussion:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Begin in Job 2:11-13. What do Job’s friends get right? How might God use the presence and empathy of friends to help us sit, walk, and/or stand through seasons of suffering? Perhaps there is a personal example or testimony to share. 2. Stepping out and looking at the broader approach of Job’s friends. Where do they go wrong? How do their behaviors and words actually serve as further affliction to Job rather than relief? 3. What does God say about Job’s friends’ words? (Job 42:7-9) How can their example demonstrate for us a pattern for what not to do when we are with those who are suffering? 4. What did Job say he was looking for from his friends? What did he want them to offer? (Job 16:1-5). Then, what confidence and hope helped Job hold onto his integrity in suffering? (Job 19:25-27). Share reflections and observations related to Job’s posture and hope in suffering. 5. Read 1 Peter 3:8-22. Reflect on or journal about how Jesus’ example gives us hope, comfort, strength, and relief when we suffer. <p><u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation & Application:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text invite us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. What lessons within this text move us towards growing in our love for one another? 3. What principles could be applied to our family life, careers, communities, or congregational life? 4. Consider how Jesus could use our application of the principles in this text to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
