



TO SUPPORT, ENCOURAGE, AND PRAY for our ministry partners near and far.




Main Floor

JOE & CORINNA CAVANAUGH, WGM

Joe and Corinna serve in the village of Bella Vista in Central Mexico. Their life experiences of divorce, drug and alcohol addiction, and emotional abuse have prepared them to bring hope as they seek to see lives transformed through discipleship and mentoring, youth and young adult ministry, education, and health care. They believe the Gospel of Jesus Christ can set people free from generational bondage, and that transformed people will transform communities.



LARRY FERGUSON, TOMORROW CLUBS

Larry serves as board member, advocate, and great supporter of Tomorrow Clubs International. Tomorrow Clubs workers are followers of Jesus Christ motivated by the Great Commission to give children and youth in forsaken places the opportunity to learn to follow Jesus. In partnership with local churches, Tomorrow Clubs bring God's love and the hope of the Gospel to communities with the goal of connecting children and their families to local congregations.



ANDY GORDLEY, ATLAS TRAVEL & STUDY ABROAD

Andy Gordley was born in Lancaster, PA, and grew up in Costa Rica and Panama. Andy returned to PA in 1992 to attend Lancaster Bible College, and started working with CMBC's youth group. In 1994 he served as the first director of the Factory Youth Center, and in 1997 helped start "Youth Link," a ministry for Pequea Valley high school students. Andy & Tina were married in 2000 and moved to Costa Rica in 2010 to work with the GAP year program of Score International. They currently run a study abroad business ministry: Atlas Travel and Study Abroad and host short term trips to Costa Rica. They now have 6 children (5 boys and 1 girl).



DEBBIE HEISE, MISSIONS OF HOPE INT. (MOHI)

Debbie has been serving and involved with Missions of Hope (MoHl) since 2007 as a member of her home church, Mountain Christian Church, in Joppa, MD. She took a staff role with MoHl in 2020 as the Director of Partner Relations. In this role, Debbie connects with existing US church partners as their key contact person for MoHl on the US side. Additionally, she works to build relationships and seek new church partnerships. Debbie lives and works from her home near Baltimore, MD. She has 2 college aged young adults, both attending colleges in Pennsylvania.

D and A have lived in Asia for 9 years. They are running a textile business and are learning a minority language with the vision to see a mature body established and the Father worshiped among Asia's people groups.



WALLACE & MARY KAMAU, MISSIONS OF HOPE INT. (MOHI)

Wallace & Mary Kamau are the founders and current leaders of Missions of Hope International (MoHI), working to financially support the mission, spearheading new programs, and furthering the footprint of ministry. Wallace & Mary quickly realized that while the people of the Mathare Valley were hungry for the word of Christ, they also needed a way to meet their most basic needs. Their first school, Mathare Family Hope Center, was opened on Sept. 4, 2000. Over the years the ministry has grown from 50 students to over 27,000 students! Wallace & Mary continue to lead the ministry to this day, along with over 1,600 Kenyan staff.



JOHN & JUDY NICELY, TEAM

John oversees TEAM's International Grant Program. This money flows out of TEAM to outside entities and is primarily money that has been raised by TEAM missionaries for specific projects i.e. building construction by a church plant or funds given to a Bible translation team. John's role includes tracking these grants, disbursing funds, and ensuring compliance through policies & procedures. The encouragement comes from seeing what God is doing in the recipient ministries around the globe. Judy's primary ministry is childcare & training. She is a part of the training and care for TEAM's MKs at orientation & other TEAM events. She also helps churches, ministries, & individual families with childcare needs.



RON SCHMIDT, CHRIST'S HOME

Ron Schmidt presently serves as the lead chaplain at Christ's Home in Warminster, PA. He pastored his home church, Davisville Baptist in Southampton, PA, for 28 years. He has taught in the Bible department at Philadelphia Biblical University as an adjunct professor. He has served as board chairman for World Team and presently serves as Chair for Endure International, a ministry committed to reaching Muslims for Christ in North Africa and the Middle East, and also helping persecuted Christians. Ron loves to share his faith and challenge believers in God's Word!

MAKSYM SLYVKA, TOMORROW CLUBS

Max serves as the Marketing/Development Director of Tomorrow Clubs International, which has its origins and roots at CMBC. The Tomorrow Clubs were started in Ukraine in 1997 and now work in 11 countries across Europe, Asia, and Africa, often in remote villages where there is little, if any, opportunity to hear the Gospel. About 917 clubs meet every week, providing long-term discipleship for children and teenagers, ages 4 to 14, mostly from unchurched families. A typical Tomorrow Club consists of 25-30 children, which means nearly 20,000 children benefit from these regular meetings.



BUD & BARB SPECK, WYCLIFFE

Bud and Barbara have served with Wycliffe Bible Translators since 1981. Bud currently serves as Communication Consultant for the Europe Area Bible translation organizations, as well as serving on the Global Communication team. They have recently moved back to North Carolina from Germany and will work remotely for Wycliffe. This gives them opportunity to be more a part of their family's lives. Barbara serves in an intercessory prayer ministry where she has extended times of worship and prayer for Wycliffe Bible Translators, churches, missionaries, and many others.



MARK & ESTELLA TROSTLE. WYCLIFFE

Having seen the impact of God's Word in their own lives, Mark and Estella believe that every person should have access to the Scriptures in a language they understand. For 33 years they have served in various administrative roles with Wycliffe in the U.S., Papua Guinea, and now the Solomon Islands. The Trostles lived a number of years in Papua New Guinea serving with the PNG Bible Translation Association (the local Papua New Guinean Wycliffe organization) in Church Engagement, Staff Care, and as Project Management mentors. In 2020, Mark and Estella returned to the U.S. and now serve in Global Partnerships as Field Coordinators for translation projects in PNG and the Solomon Islands, traveling a couple times a year to check on projects and encourage on-the-ground partners. Estella also serves as an Intercultural Engagement Specialist for Wycliffe U.S.
