<p style="text-align: center;">Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with Prayer -ask Jesus to guide your time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p>Read the Text -read the text together. (1 Cor. 10:23-11:1)</p> <p>Discussion Guiding Questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In verses 23-24, Paul reveals the lifestyle patterns, attitudes, and behaviors that he is living out and desiring the Church to live out. What are the words that he uses, and how can we live out these ideals in community with one another? 2. Talk about Paul's use of Psalm 24:1 in verse 26. Line it up with his communication of a similar principle to Timothy in 1 Tim. 4:3-5. How does Paul view meat sacrificed to idols? 3. In verses 27-28 Paul anticipates that believers may find themselves invited over for dinner with an unbelieving friend. In this, what kind of relationships does Paul presume Christians in Corinth will be building with their unbelieving neighbors? How can you strengthen and build relationships with your unbelieving friends, family, and neighbors? 4. In verses 31-33 Paul is drawing his conclusions that summarize much of his thoughts in this portion of his letter (8-11:1). Identify the principles that are governing the behaviors and attitudes of Christians living in community with one another. 5. In what ways might we ensure that our knowledge is tethered to and guided by love, and that our rights and freedoms are tethered to and guided by love?
