Good Intentions

We all have heard ourselves say words like "I'm sorry – I had good intentions", or "I really meant to do that, I had good intentions", or "I didn't actually mean that, I had good intentions", or something close to these statements. What exactly are "good intentions"? Intentions are our thoughts that include a desire or determination that we'd like to see something happen, good or bad. So good intentions are merely thoughts of good things that we'd like to do or say or help something to happen in some way. I can think of many good intentions that I have – sometimes on a daily basis - all the things I'd like to accomplish in a day, but the day seems to go by and the good intentions, incomplete, rise to the surface as the sun sets. We all have those lists or ideas of things we'd like to do but never seem to get to. Good intentions. Do we always run out of time, do we run out of motivation, or do our priorities waiver?

Good intentions are certainly found in our faith habits as well. We intend to follow God's commandments. We intend to pray faithfully, not just in times of our own desperate needs, but always and for others too. We intend to thank God for all of our blessings, not losing sight of them by wishing and wanting for more. Do we say, "Oh, I had good intentions of bringing in canned goods" or something else that is needed for others. Or "I really meant to call her – I heard she was ill." Or "I saw a new couple in church and had good intentions of greeting them, but time got away". So many good intentions fill our days.

The Bible has several verses that relate to good intentions. Two are included below:

1 John 3:18 Little children let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

2 Corinthians 9:7 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

These two verses could help guide us as we look into the new year. Our hearts are renewed from the spirit of God's love told to us again throughout the Advent season. God continues to surround us with love and care. He gave us His son. He is there for us through difficult times – holding us close and leading us even when we don't know where we are headed. His love is unconditional. We are His disciples, filled with good intentions as we begin 2024. Perhaps it is the best time to examine our good intentions; to love others in our deeds and in truths, not just our words and talk. This year we could be cheerful givers – giving those good intentions a more serious effort...following through with our good intentions in our faith habits as well as participating in our church family. We are hearing often from our council and church leadership about the need for help and more giving. Our Christian love and care is needed now more than ever to support each other through 2024. This just may be the perfect time for us to follow through with our good intentions.

Halcyon is recognized as the major provider of psychosocial rehabilitation services in Lebanon County.
