### 2022 ANNUAL REPORT – ST. DAVID CHURCH COUNCIL

The Pastor, along with 12 members and 1 youth representative elected by the congregation, a Treasurer, and a Financial Secretary make up the Council. The elected members serve a 3-year term with one-third elected on a yearly rotation. The youth representative has a 1-year term. The Council has general oversight of the congregation. In January, the Council has a retreat. Council meets the second Sunday of each month at 6:30 pm in the Zela Boozer Conference Room.

#### MAJOR ACTIVITIES OF COUNCIL DURING 2022:

- 1. Interviewed and hired Interim Pastor to serve during Pastor Greg's deployment to Germany.
- 2. Approved AED (Automated Electronic Defibrillators) training for staff and various group members.
- 3. Approved hiring an intern from the seminary's Intern Program for the term of one-year.
- 4. Updated Instant Church Directory.
- 5. Approved for the refurbish and repair of the five-octave set of handbells.
- 6. Approved revised Church Use Policy. The policy sets forth requirements for reserving, using, cleaning, and securing any part of the church facilities.
- 7. Approved the purchase of a digital church sign previously approved by the congregation.
- 8. Approved revised Safe Haven Policy and the training of church staff, youth chaperones, and Sunday School teachers on this policy.
- 9. Monitored and adjusted COVID protocol as necessary.
- 10. Approved various projects throughout the year for property committee for maintenance and improvements to the church. Among those are removal of the shrubbery from around the church since most of it was either dead or diseased and replace with mulch, refurbishing the church parking lot by resurfacing, restriping lines and filling cracks in the pavement and painting the bleachers in the gym.

A master list was made of all Sunday church bulletins housed in the archives. The first bulletin is dated December 30, 1945. Many bulletins are missing for the years 1945-1955, but only a few are missing for the years beginning with 1956 and going to present.

For the past 11 years, the Archives Room has been shared with the Social Ministry Committee's Snack Sack Program. Food is stored and bagged here for distribution to the children at Oak Grove Elementary School.

**Purpose**: To communicate with and provide a link between St. David and all students attending institutions of higher learning. This communication says to the student that "your church remembers and cares about you."

#### **Accomplishments:**

- 1. Campus Ministry identified 9 college students for the 2021-2022 school year and 5 college students for the 2022-2023 school year.
- 2. Campus ministry sent "Christ in Our Home" devotional books quarterly to students.
- 3. The annual breakfast honoring high school and college graduates was resumed following a hiatus due to Covid. The congregation recognized 3 high school graduates and 3 college graduates on May 22, 2022.

### CEMETERY AND MEMORIALS COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT – 2022

of the St. David Lutheran Church of the ELCA

<u>MISSION</u>: We strive to provide compassionate personal service by assisting members in funeral preplanning and during their time of loss.

#### **HOW WE DO THIS:**

- We assign burial plots; work closely with church staff for funeral services and funeral directors to identify and supervise the opening and closing of graves; coordinate with the family and monument companies on the installation of permanent markers, coping and other improvements; and maintain the cemetery grounds.
- We endeavor to be transparent, dependable and accountable for accurate documentation of church cemetery burial records to include recognition of military and 1st responder Veterans.
- We acknowledge donors then inform honorees or the next of kin of memorials.

#### **ACTIVITIES DURING 2022** (see Attachment 1- Details):

- <u>Cemetery Assignments:</u> 26 ground spaces (21 members and 5 non-members) plus 4 niches (2 members and 2 non-members) in our Columbarium
- Quit Claims (plots returned to the church for re-assignment): 0
- <u>Committals</u> at St. David Cemetery: 12 (8 members and 4 nonmembers) Church members buried at another cemetery: 1 (plus 1 cremation only - not interred)
- <u>Donor Acknowledgments:</u> 278 Memorials plus 7 Honorariums/Donations with cards to the donors, and letters updated monthly listing donors to the departed's next of kin or those honored
- Columbarium Faceplates: Replaced 3 with more legible engraved faceplates
- <u>Church Membership Update</u>: Only members are normally authorized burial. Council continues study.

### **SPECIAL EVENTS** (see Attachment 2 - Photos):

• Cemetery Clean-Up Days: April 30th and October 29th

Thompson and Caughman-Harman Funeral Homes of Lexington donated U.S. Flags to honor our veterans, and the Malejko family replaced damaged flags as required; flags fly year-round. Also placed permanent grave markers for newly interred veterans.

• Veteran Recognition:

Provided the names for publication in the November 13th bulletin of former and current church member Veterans who served or are serving now in the military or as first responders. We thank them for their sacrificial service including those who died for our benefit.

- A Laying of the Crosses ceremony, coordinated by Denise (Malejko) Scott, was held on December 3rd in memory of deceased military and first responder Veterans.
- <u>Future Burial Plots</u>: Laid out a new part of the cemetery, to be designated as "St. David Memorial Park West" where only ground-level markers will be allowed. Assigned identifiers to these spaces.
- <u>Cemetery Records</u>: Researched the church archives, internet and obituaries in local newspapers to help fill in missing information on former church members.

#### **2023 GOALS**:

- Encourage burial applications, especially where there are unassigned plots in "family" squares
- Recruit and train new Cemetery Committee members
- Update Ch 22 Cemetery of our church Constitution

Children's Church provides children with an opportunity to participate in worship and to learn about the structure and purpose of the service. It helps to prepare children to become participants in the regular worship service and gives them a better understanding of the different parts of the service.

There are 2 leaders each week who are scheduled on a rotation. Children's Church is offered every Sunday. There is no age requirement as all children are welcome who prefer this worship setting as an alternative that may be directed more towards their age, attention span, or learning style. Children are dismissed after the children's sermon, and return to the congregation before communion. The structure of this ministry is modeled after the service in that the children begin by carrying the cross down the hall to the room, lighting candles on the altar, singing a song, collecting offering, taking prayer requests and praying, reciting the Lord's Prayer and extinguishing the candles. After this, the lesson is introduced which is based on one of the scripture readings for that Sunday. The lesson may include games, crafts, singing or other activities chosen by the leaders each week.

The children are always willing to share their prayer requests and praises. They offer ideas of their favorite songs they want to sing. They volunteer to light the candles or collect the offering. Children assist in leading the Lord's prayer. The kids exhibit joy and excitement as the Holy Spirit works within them.

Children's church has been established for 16 years now. Thanks to the congregation for your continued support!

## EVANGELISM COMMITTEE ANUAL REPORT 2022

In January the committee began work on a survey to identify priorities for the year. The process lasted a few months. Results related to other areas of responsibility were shared with a number of the leaders involved in those areas. They were free to do as they chose with the information.

From priorities that emerged for the Evangelism Committee, a top priority had to do with the welcoming and assimilating new members.

- A picnic was planned, inviting all the new members who'd been received during the pandemic. Congregational leaders and a few other key people also attended. It was a good opportunity for people to interact and get better acquainted. It was determined that having this kind of event would be helpful moving into the future.
- Part of assimilating new members is the development of small group ministries. The committee worked to initiate the Bread Breakers social group program. Thirty-six members signed up. They were divided into six groups of six. Each group was given two names of people to invite to join their group. The list was compiled in consultation with Pastor Fred and others. The groups were initiated in October, asking them to gather once a month for a meal through May, 2023. Date, time and locations would be selected by each group. At the end of this first round, it will be important to evaluate, and find ways of improving for the next year.
- Bread Breakers and small groups like it are good for existing members as well. The survey identified individuals to be new member sponsors. We did not utilize them for the folks brought in during the pandemic, however, they will be a good resource for moving into the future.

Looking towards 2023, the committee decided to get involved with the SOAR program. It will be initiated in 2023. In addition to supporting a children's soccer sports program, it has the potential for increasing the visibility of our congregation.

We initiated a revival of Sunday morning coffee. We will consider re-initiating it again in 2023.

Evangelism overlaps with the work of most ministries within the congregation. For instance while others took the lead with the new church sign, the topic remains an agenda item for the committee.

Earlier in 2022, I took leadership of the committee as Interim Chair. Our thanks goes to Deni Titcomb for having served as chair until then. Of course, to do the work, it takes others. I am grateful to the individuals who participated as they were able. Thanks to Lee and Beverly Breuer, Bob Hubbs, Cindy Lown, Julie McFarland, Janet Riddle, Sandra Ross, Marvin and Renee Sox and Deni Titcomb. We are also grateful to Gary Dooley, our council liaison, as he was also actively involved.

The mission of the Property Committee is to ensure the Church is maintained and kept in a good state of repair. The committee with Council approval pays the bills for contracts and maintenance of all church property and facilities. #### Accomplishments and improvements in 2022

### SAFETY TASK FORCE ANNUAL REPORT 2022

In 2018, a safety task force was created to assess safety procedures and the physical structures at St. David Lutheran Church. Safety task force members created a fire prevention and emergency action plan to address critical safety needs. The purpose of the safety plan was to detail procedures to detect, notify, and respond to various likely emergency situations such as fire, building evacuation, severe weather, natural disasters, workplace violence, intruders, medical emergencies, and bomb threats. It is highly encouraged that all St. David members read the safety plan which can be acquired directly through the church office. The safety plan also established guidelines for creating a safety team.

Members of St. David Lutheran Church comprise a safety team that will work with the usher teams to insure the safety of church members and visitors. Safety team members volunteer to be on the team and their inclusion on the team must be approved by church council. Actions taken by safety team members in fulfilling their duties are by individual choice. Safety team members will not hold liable St. David Lutheran Church for any injuries or legal actions that may result from actions directly related to safety team member duties. Safety team members are Gary Dooley, James Riddle, Brad Sox, Kevin Sox, Matt Schnabel, John Dodgen, Chick Roof, Mike Sox, and Jim Bickley.

The safety team met to review the safety team duties. Significant points:

- Matt Schnabel will check and resupply the first aid kits, trauma kits, and AED twice a year.
- Two charged, portable two-way radios will be picked up from the usher cupboard before church service with one being placed in the nursery by the safety team member on duty each Sunday. The second radio will remain on the safety team member on duty in case the need for communication to nursery staff is needed. Radio battery levels will be checked and placed on a charger if necessary.
- Safety team members will check fire extinguishers and AEDs once/month when on usher team duty. AEDs are located in the narthex and hallway between the Family Life Center and Fellowship Hall.
- Incident reports are in the safety plan notebook in the usher cupboard.
- Training and certification for identified staff and church members in first aid, CPR, and use of the AEDs was completed for 19 church members in April. Their certification is good for two years.

#### Priorities for 2023:

- A locking mechanism for the adult choir room (must need to be locked from the inside without the need for a key) to make this a functional safe area during a lockdown

### SOCIAL MINISTRY ANNUAL REPORT 2022

The goals of the Social Ministry Committee are to minister to those in need within our congregation and community and look for new opportunities for expanding the services through the following ministries:

- Provide volunteers at Mission Lexington (LICS) Thrift Shop the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month.
   Serve meals at the Washington Street Soup Kitchen every 5<sup>th</sup> Friday during the year and
- donate \$200 each time.
- 3. Host Lowman Home guests in conjunction with Young-at-Heart for a meal and Entertainment in August.
- 4. Sponsor and plan a Christmas Project for St. David Congregation. (for 2021 we cosponsored with the ELCA Good Gifts Initiative.
- 5. Collect and deliver food to Mission Lexington (LICS) that is donated by St. David monthly. 840 pounds of food was collected in 2022.)
- 6. Trustees of the Lottie Mae Cannon Social Ministry Fund. (Establish and stock a small food pantry at St. David to offer to those with immediate needs. Funds are provided from Lottie Mae Cannon Fund.)
- 7. In October 2011, St. David Social Ministry Committee began a mission outreach program with Zion Lutheran Church to provide food/snacks for children who are without enough food when school is closed for weekends and holidays. For the 2021 school year Oak Grove Elementary requested 125 snack sacks per week. These were delivered to the school during October, December, February and April on each Wednesday morning to be handed out at the end of the day to those children identified by teachers and guidance counselors to receive a snack sack.
- 8. In 2017 St. David Church Council adopted to support a new ministry, the LICS/Mission Lexington Mobile Food Pantry. This is intended to involve our youth. It has a budget line item of \$2,000.
- 9. 2023 has not been a normal year for the Social Ministry Committee. Due to the Covid-19 Virus Mission Lexington did not use volunteers in its Thrift Store and the Washington Street United Methodist Church did not use volunteers in its Soup Kitchen. Social Ministry did continue with partnership with Zion Lutheran Church to provide Snack Sacks for the children at Oak Grove Elementary during the school year.

A special thanks to St. David and those volunteers that gave of their time and talent so that these ministries were carried out.

Young at Heart (YAH) meetings are for all individuals 55 and older. Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month at 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall. Meetings consists of a covered dish luncheon, devotions, business meeting and entertainment. 


