Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

April arrives this year with the lingering echoes of Easter joy still ringing in our ears. We have once again walked the road from the solemn reflection of Lent to the radiant celebration of the Resurrection. Yet Easter is not a single day—it is a season, a way of life, and a truth that reshapes everything.

The resurrection of Jesus is not just an event we remember; it is a promise we live in. Because Christ is risen, we know that sin does not have the final word. Because Christ is risen, death itself has been defeated. Because Christ is risen, your life—right now—is filled with hope that cannot be taken away.

It is easy, however, for that Easter joy to fade as routines return and the busyness of life presses in. The world quickly shifts our attention back to worries, responsibilities, and uncertainties. But the good news of Easter calls us to something deeper: to live each day as people of the resurrection.

What does that look like?

It looks like forgiveness freely given, even when it is difficult. It looks like hope spoken into conversations filled with fear or doubt. It looks like trusting God's promises when circumstances seem uncertain. And it looks like gathering together around Word and Sacrament, where the risen Christ continues to meet us, strengthen us, and send us out.

In April, we continue to celebrate this Easter reality. Each Sunday is a reminder that the tomb is still empty and Christ is still alive. Each time we hear the Word, Christ speaks life into our hearts again. Each time we receive God's gifts, God renews and restores us.

As a congregation, we also have opportunities this month to live out our faith together—through worship, fellowship, and service. I encourage you to stay connected, to reach out to one another, and to be intentional about sharing the hope we have in Christ with those around us.

If you are carrying burdens this season, know this: the risen Lord sees you, knows you, and walks with you. Easter is God's declaration that no darkness is too deep, no sorrow too heavy, and no situation beyond His redeeming power.

So, as we move through April, let us hold fast to the joy of the resurrection—not just as a memory, but as our daily reality. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

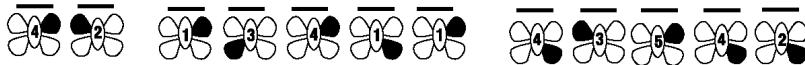
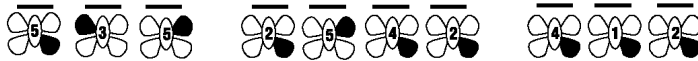
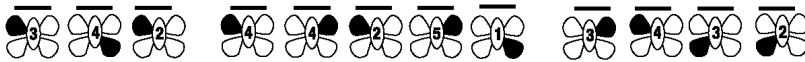
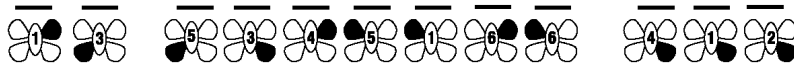
The Angel's Message

CEMETERY CHANGES

For the first 165 years, families were given “Family Squares” in the St. David Cemetery. Several generations were often buried together in their square. There were no burial plot assignment forms, and as far as we know, no map showing who was buried where.

ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES: A survey of the cemetery wasn’t done until 2000 when burial locations were shown on a plat. A burial space assignment form was established too but was rarely used. A *Request for Assignment of Burial Space* form has been required since 2014. A spreadsheet of burials was started in 2009 which has expanded to include not only birth and death dates but also parents, baptism, confirmation, marriage and veteran information which is kept up to date in hard copy and electronic files. Family squares are no longer allotted; each burial space is now assigned to a church member and sometimes, with Council approval and concurrent payment of a burial fee, to a non-member who is related to a church member. At first non-members could delay payment of their burial fee but in 2016 the Council required concurrent payment. Assignment of burial space for minors is now encouraged to be postponed until they become an adult (18 years or older) so they can decide for themselves if they want to be buried in the St. David Cemetery; they can be assigned spaces later with or near family if available. As societal dynamics evolved with increased mobility, many family members moved away leaving empty plots which are now subject for the church to reclaim. Due to this past year’s efforts, almost 200 plots have been returned to the church, delaying the need to open new areas of our cemetery for maybe a couple of decades. There have also been over 100 burial assignments.

PHYSICAL CHANGES: A Columbarium was built in 2014, and niches are available at a cost to both members and approved non-members. Burial assignment fees and donations in the last 10 years funded Founding Member plaques, veteran markers with flags, widening of an access road, repaving, and construction of a new access road. West and North Memorial Gardens were laid out as future sections of our cemetery with wider access lanes, ground-level monuments, no coping or gravel, and space for another Columbarium. Though the Property Committee contracts for ground maintenance from Spring to Fall and the Cemetery Committee has sponsored clean-up days, it is each family’s responsibility for the upkeep of the burial plots of their loved ones by weeding and changing out flowers with the holidays and seasons.

MEMBERSHIP: The Cemetery Committee is looking for Millennials, Gen-Zs and Gen-Xers to assist our Boomers to help carry on our administrative responsibilities and coordination with the Pastor and funeral homes when one of our members pass. The committee’s next meeting is on April 19th at 3:00 pm in Conference Room 105.
