

"Words and Actions!"

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I expect that every one of us has heard the old adage, "Actions speak louder than words!" I also expect that throughout the course of our lives, we find this insight to be consistently true! A recent vivid reminder of this truth came recently to us in the form of Gospel proclamation on the Fifth Sunday After Pentecost. On this Sunday, we heard the familiar parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:27-35). The context for the parable is an exchange taking place between an expert in the law and Jesus. In response to the expert's question, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?", Jesus asks the expert what the law says. Drawing from the Deuteronomic and Levitical codes, the expert responds, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

Jesus responds, "You have given the right answer; do this and you will live." But wanting to justify himself, he asks Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus responds with a parable – the parable of the Good Samaritan. At the conclusion of both parable and the Gospel, it is evident that while the expert in the law knows the letter of the law...action is needed! Jesus' parting words to the expert to "Go and do likewise." resonate with the adage, "Actions speak louder than words!"

As disciples of Jesus, we are called not only to be hearers of the Word, but doers of the Word! Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable and are expressed not only by what we say, but more importantly by what we do in our lives! Each day, God graces us with opportunities to not only hear the Word, but to respond to the Word by actively living out our faith through acts of compassion, mercy, generosity, kindness, grace, and love! As Martin Luther says, "God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does!" As we live in response to God's Word and God's love, both our neighbor and we are blessed. Our lives are both filled and fulfilled! May we not only be hearers of God's Word, but doers as well!

Reaching Out to Our Neighbor

"Who is my neighbor?" "When you have done it unto the least of these my brethren, you have done it unto me!"

While we reach out to our neighbors in local ministry here as St. David, we also faithfully reach out across our state, nation, and world as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Together, we are able to reach out to our neighbors in amazing, life-changing and lifegiving ways that we cannot do alone! Here are some ways in which we are reaching out together:

ELCA World Hunger - Seeking to eliminate hunger, poverty, and food insecurity both nationally and internationally through present projects in 34 US states and territories and 63 countries. Provides for health clinics, food pantries, soup kitchens, advocacy, and other means for addressing the root causes of hunger.

Lutheran Services in America – One of the largest faith-based health and human services networks in the USA. Presently serves 1 in 50 Americans each year by providing health care, alcohol and drug treatment, disaster response, counseling, employment assistance, housing for homeless, adoption and foster care, veterans assistance programs and transitional housing, developmental disability services, pregnancy counseling, senior adult care, child abuse prevention, and other services.

Lutheran Disaster Response – National and international response and assistance accompanying impacted communities from immediate response and relief to long-term recovery in face of disasters.

Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services – Largest faith-based national nonprofit dedicated to refugee resettlement and immigration in the USA. More than 80 years of service helping more than half a million immigrants and refugees by providing compassionate help and hope as they rebuild their lives.

ARE YOU LOOKING FOR A NEW WAY to engage in fellowship with your brothers and sisters at St. David? Beginning this fall, we're starting a new ministry called Bread Breakers. It is a monthly opportunity to gather with other members of the congregation to enjoy some fellowship and a meal. You can either meet in your homes or go out to a restaurant, whichever your group chooses to do is fine! Here's the catch—the groups are assigned at random! This way, each year you'll have a new group to get to know, and will have the opportunity to develop relationship with folks in the congregation that you might not otherwise get to know outside of Sunday mornings. Each group will typically be 6-8 people, a mix of singles and couples, from different age groups. ELW 884, 885

Written in 1684, the doxology – as we call it – is considered the first HYMN written in the English language. Only the psalms were sung by people, and then only in church. Ken was a protestant chaplain at a boys school, and he wrote three hymns with several verses to be used in their private devotions: a morning hymn, an evening hymn, and a midnight hymn when sleep was difficult. Each hymn had the doxology as its last verse.

ELW 557 Awake, My Soul, and with the sun

thy daily stage of duty run;

shake off dull sloth, and joyful rise

to pay thy morning sacrifice.

ELW 565 All Praise to Thee, My God, this night

for all the blessings of the light,

Keep me, oh, keep me, King of Kings, beneath thine own almighty wings.

Midnight Hymn My God, now I from sleep awake,

the sole possession of me take; from midnight terrors me secure,

and guard my heart from thoughts impure.

Ken was later made a bishop but as a Protestant, he was sent to the Tower of London for several years when the Catholic King James II ruled. He was later released and went into retirement.

Many of you my age probably remember singing the Doxology every Sunday. Not a bad idea.

Highlights from the July 2022 St. David Church Council Meeting

The St. David Congregation Council met in its monthly meeting on Sunday, July 10, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the conference room. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

<u>Congregational Life:</u> There will be a Sending reception for Joel following the service on Sunday, August 7th. The service at Camp Kinard and picnic will be Sunday, September 11. Council approved the recommendation to have a covered dish meal.

<u>Instant Church Directory:</u> Danny continues to update member profiles in the online Instant Church directory. This app is available to be downloaded by members of the congregation.

Property: The parking lot repairs have been scheduled to begin in July.

<u>Snack Pack Ministry</u>: Snack packs are on hold until August when school starts back. Social Ministry continues to monitor the need for volunteers at the soup kitchen.

<u>Young At Heart</u>: Social Ministry is coordinating with the Lowman Home to have some of the residents brought to the Young At Heart meeting in August.

<u>My Amigos</u>: My Amigos is in need of volunteers to do clerical work and prep materials on Wednesdays and Fridays of each week.

<u>Interim Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Suhr reported that there has been an increase in members who have been hospitalized and in rehab facilities this past month.

He attended the SC Synod Assembly in Charleston and reported that future assemblies will be in Columbia or on Zoom to help keep costs down.

<u>Children, Youth and Family Ministries:</u> Joel reported that the reservation for the beach house for the Youth Beach Retreat in July was canceled; however, he found a place in Wilmington, NC for half the cost of the previous house.

Joel will preach in North Charleston on July 10, and Ben will preach in Spartanburg on Sunday, July 17.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The treasurer's reports were reviewed and discussed. It was noted that the goal for the church sign has been met due to a gift given by a family. There is now about \$47,000 in the Church Sign Fund. It was also reported that the landscaping company is increasing their costs to include a fuel surcharge.

<u>Medical Equipment:</u> Rivon Van Laan and Pam Fox have agreed to manage the church's medical equipment. Currently, the equipment will stay at the church house; however, as space becomes available, the equipment will be moved to the church.

<u>Covid Protocol Update:</u> The congregation is reminded to fill out the pew books on Sundays.

Deployment Update: A member requested and received a Thrivent donation of \$250 for supplies for the Military Care ministry. Cards and other items are needed to send to those deployed. The next care packages will be sent in August for Labor Day.

<u>Church Sign:</u> A group of committee chairs and council members met to discuss and review the specifics of the church sign with a representative of SignTech. The group recommended the 6 Megapixel resolution. Council approved the recommendation. The Church Sign Fund has sufficient funds to cover the cost of the sign. The sign will be ordered.

<u>Safe Haven Policy:</u> The updated St. David Safe Haven Policy was reviewed by Carrie Nettles, Victim Services Specialist with the Julie Valentine Center in Greenville and by Council. Council approved the revised Safe Haven Policy. The Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministries will run all background checks. Training will be set up for teachers and other staff members.

<u>Member Request:</u> Corinne Lord's request to join St. David as an associate member was approved. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.






Picture Frame

- 5. When the glue is drv. slide your photo in.




