That light is for you.

Christ is born *for you*—and for the life of the world.

May this Advent season grant you moments of stillness, hope, and renewal. And may the celebration of Christ's birth fill your heart and home with peace.

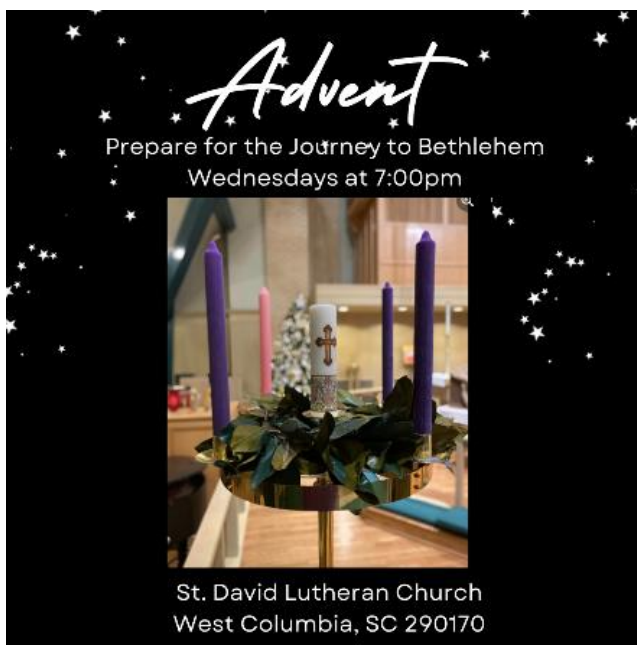

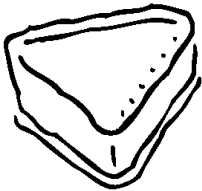

A Gift for Someone Special

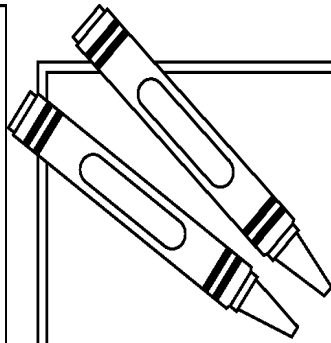
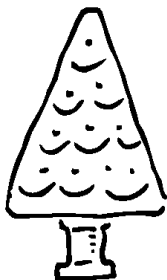
You will need:

- ▲ a pie/wedge-shaped plastic container with lid
- ▲ an empty thread spool
- ▲ green felt
- ▲ brown felt
- ▲ craft glue
- ▲ scissors
- ▲ variety of trims — beads, glitter, sequins, etc.
- ▲ nuts or candy



How to make:

1. Cut green felt to fit lid of container.
2. Glue in place.
3. Cut brown felt to cover spool.
4. Glue it on to spool.
5. Decorate "tree" with trim.
6. Glue "trunk" in place.
7. Let dry.
8. Fill with nuts or candy for a special gift.
