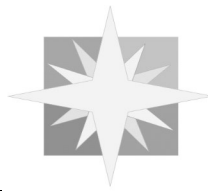

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is hard to believe that the season of Lent is again just around the corner. This year at St. David, Lent will be a little bit different. Generally people talk about what they're giving up for Lent since it is a penitential season, marked by the three great Christian spiritual practices: prayer, fasting and alms giving. Beginning Ash Wednesday, we're going to fast together as a congregation, and the good news is, you don't have to *do* anything to participate. In worship, we're going to fast from our primary instrument that leads us in worship. There will be no organ music from Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday.

Additionally, we're going to create some space for encouraging a richer prayer life. One of the ways we're going to do that is to ask that when you come into worship on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings, that you do so as quietly as possible so that we don't disturb others who are praying. We also hope to have the prayer room available in the very near future so that if you'd like to come in during the week, there will be a dedicated space for you. If the prayer room isn't yet available, please know that you can always utilize the sanctuary for a place for quiet prayer.

On Wednesday evenings in Lent, we'll worship using Holden Evening Prayer at 7pm. This year there will not be meals before worship. The theme for our Lenten Vespers services will be *Using our Senses to Enrich Our Worship*. Each week of the 5 week series, we'll explore what it looks like for us to engage each of our senses in worship. If you've not ever attended our Wednesday evening services during Lent, this year offers a unique opportunity to learn something on Wednesdays that will be immediately applicable every other Sunday of the church year.

I hope that you'll take the opportunity to invest in your faith during this upcoming season so that we might be drawn even closer together in the fellowship of God and one another.

Luther's musical setting of Psalm 130 is one of his earlier chorales, written during the time he was revising the mass. Luther was basing worship on scripture. It is called a re-form-ation, not a replacement after all. His "back to basics" approach to worship included writing chorales – hymns – based on scripture as well. He wrote the hymns in German for his people, and often composed the music for them.

When Luther challenged the Catholic Church, he put his life in danger. He listed 95 reasons that the Church needed to change its ways. His fear and distress must have seemed bottomless. Yet,

*In you alone, O God, we hope, and not in our own merit.
We rest our fears in your good Word and trust your Holy Spirit.
Your promise keeps us strong and sure; we trust the cross,
your signature, inscribed upon our temples.*

During Lent this year, our worship will emphasize devotion. We will use the piano instead of the organ to promote a worship experience that is quieter and more deeply personal. Ash Wednesday's liturgy is based on Psalm 51: *Have mercy on me, O God; and also, Create in me a clean heart, O God.* Luther quotes Psalm 130

My soul is waiting for you, Lord, as one who longs for morning.

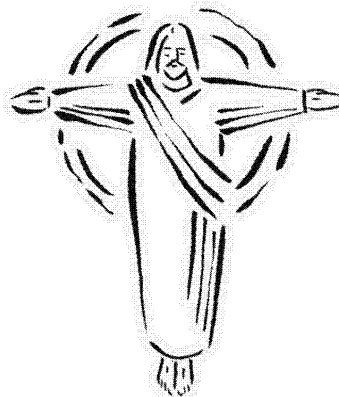

How to make it:

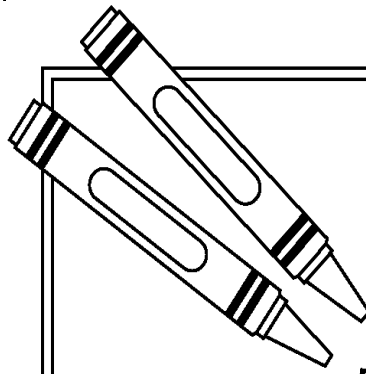
- ♥ Use the wax paper as a working surface.

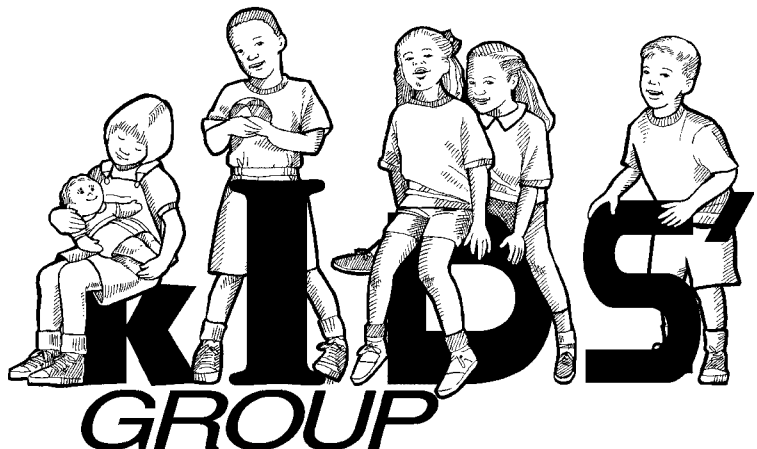
