Recently I traveled to Trier, the oldest city in Germany that was one of the capitols of the Roman Empire. One of the remarkable sites there is a meeting hall that was built by Constantine in the 300s AD that is now a Lutheran Church! The cathedral in Trier was completed in 1270 AD. It was a nice weekend trip.

We received your care packages on Friday, June 24th, and folks here really enjoyed them. It's been fun to walk around and talk to the Soldiers about who signed their cards and for them to hear about the wonderful people that sent them things. The kids cards made at VBS were a big hit!

WORSHIP NOTES



This is my song, O God of all the nations

I treat Patriotic Sunday differently than other Sundays. It's not found on the Liturgical Calendar, so choosing what to

focus on requires some extra thought. I turn to the back of the hymnal, to a section of National Songs. Just as language use identifies a people as a national group, a National song or anthem usually reflects the history or beliefs of a country. It is a unifying force and a source of pride. How thrilling it is to hear The Star Spangled Banner played at the Olympic trials or the beginning of an orchestra performance. Less thrilling are some performances at sports games (I'm thinking of you, Roseann).

We still struggle with how to play the roles of church and state, just like Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin did. We are still interpreting what is constitutional. Should the religious beliefs of a church be forced on all citizens? A New England governor tried to pass a law that all who did not worship the Christian God should be executed. Does freedom of religion include freedom from religion?

So in a service centered on the worship of the Almighty God, how do we treat a national song? My Country, 'Tis of Thee sweet land of liberty, a quasinational anthem, doesn't mention God until the fourth verse, and then only as the author of our liberty. Our national anthem, written by Francis Scott Key in 1814, is about the British attack on Fort McHenry. Compare it to another of his poems:

Before you, Lord, we bow, our God who reigns above and rules the world below with boundless power and love. Our thanks we bring in joy and praise, our hearts we raise, to you we sing!

ELW 891 is a prayer:

God bless Our Native Land; firm may it ever stand through storm and night.

So shall our prayers arise to God above the skies, on whom we wait.

Thou who art ever nigh, guarding with watchful eye, to thee aloud we cry: God save the state.

So on "patriotic" Sunday, we thank God for the blessings given our country. We pray for his guidance as we discern his will.

ELW 887 is a song turned prayer. Lloyd Stone wrote two verses in 1934, recognizing O God of all the nations. After describing his country's beauty and blessings, where his heart lies, he turns to

...but other hearts in other lands are beating with hopes and dreams as true and high as mine.

And...

So hear my prayer, O God of all the nations; a song of peace for their land and for mine.

Georgia Harkness was asked by the Methodist church to add a third verse:

This is my prayer, O God of all earth's kingdoms, your kingdom come; on earth your will be done. O God, be lifted up till all shall serve you, and hearts united learn to live as one. So hear my prayer, O God of all the nations; myself I give you; let your will be done.

During the Civil War, when a general said to Abraham Lincoln "God is on our side". President Lincoln answered, "Let us pray, general, that we are on God's side".

ARE YOU LOOKING FOR A NEW WAY to engage in fellowship with your brothers and sisters at St. David? Beginning this fall, we're starting a new ministry called Bread Breakers. It is a monthly opportunity to gather with other members of the congregation to enjoy some fellowship and a meal. Highlights from the June 2022 St. David Church Council Meeting

The St. David Congregation Council met in its regular monthly meeting on Sunday, June 12, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the conference room. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

- *Evangelism: Julia Shreve from Evangelism presented the results of the recent evangelism survey. Survey data will go out to specific committees and ministries for review, discussion, and possible implementation.
- *Worship & Music: A number of members have expressed a desire to return to having lay readers read the lessons for worship. Council voted to return to the practice.
- *Learning: VBS is June 13-16. Sunday School will combine all children's age groups during the summer.
- *Property: All shrubs, including the dead and diseased ones, have been removed from around the church. Mulch to be placed in all the surrounding beds. The committee will move forward on the gym floor as soon as a few pending details have been resolved. The goal for the new sign has been met. Council approved the recommendation to go ahead with ordering the sign.
- *Instant Church Directory: Danny Shull will assemble a committee to update the Instant Church Directory.
- *Committee Project: Kirsten Davis will be spearheading an effort to survey committees for information on their specific duties and responsibilities as well as lists of their active members. This data will be shared with the congregation through the Lamplighter and other means of communication. A booklet for new members with this info is also planned.
- *Youth & Family Ministries: A Bible study for the youth is scheduled this summer on Thursday nights at San Jose. The July beach trip has a total of seventeen youth and five adults signed up to go.
- *Deployment Update: Pastor Greg and his unit have arrived safely in Germany. The children at VBS will be making cards to send the soldiers for July 4th.
- *Church Use Policy: Council approved a revised policy for use of the church and facilities. The policy sets forth the requirements for reserving, using, cleaning, and securing any part of the church facilities.
- *First Sunday Communion: Due to confusion related to traffic flow with first Sunday communion, ushers will direct one side of the congregation at a time to receive communion as desired at either the altar or the designated area at floor level.
- *Interim Pastor's Report: Pastor Suhr is attending the SC Synod Assembly in Charleston, June 12-14.
- *Medical Equipment: Currently, medical equipment stored in the church house is not being managed. The need for someone to monitor and reply to requests for medical equipment was discussed. A volunteer(s) is needed to facilitate this ministry.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
