Dear Friends in Christ,

I'm still getting used to the wickedly hot temperatures that summer in South Carolina bring. It's my first full summer here—at least I'm more adjusted than I was last year!—and I've found myself drawn to the water. It's cool and refreshing, and spending time in the water, whether in a lake, river, beach, or even a backyard sprinkler, it's a fun way to spend a few hours of a hot, summer day.

There's something about water that brings refreshment, renewal, and a sense of peace. It stirs memories and tells stories, many of which connect deeply to our faith.

Think of childhood summers spent splashing in creeks, fishing with grandparents, or watching the waves roll in at the shore. Water holds stories—of joy, rest, and sometimes challenge. In Scripture, water is also a central image, both in the literal and spiritual sense. From the parted Red Sea that led the Israelites to freedom, to the calming of the stormy sea by Jesus' hand, to the gift of baptism where water marks us as children of God—these are water stories, and they are also *our* stories.

Summer offers us a sacred invitation to slow down, to notice the ripples of God's presence in our lives, and to be renewed in body and spirit. It is a season that mirrors baptism in many ways—cooling what's overheated, washing away the dust of busy schedules, and reminding us of the lifegiving power of God's grace.

As you enjoy time near the water this summer—whether boating, swimming, or simply dipping your toes—take a moment to remember your baptism. Let the water remind you that you are loved, forgiven, and called. And if you're spending time with family or friends by the water, share those stories—of faith, of growing up, of how God has been present in your life. Water holds stories, but so do you.

May the rest of your summer be filled with laughter, peace and holy moments. And may you find Christ walking beside you on the shore, calling you once again to life and love.



Notice for Youth Parents: Fall Student Bible Distribution (Sunday, August 17)

This past Lenten season at St. David, Pastor Greg and I (Pastor Madison) focused the Wednesday evening worship services and activities on remembering baptismal promises. These are promises that stay with us through our whole life, and it's important that we remember them so we can continue living in this covenant of baptism with God and with each other. The beauty of our baptismal promises is that you, parents, aren't expected to keep these promises on your own. You have a church and a community that equips you to serve as a guide for your students and families to explore faith together in accordance with these promises. Part of the church's role is to give you the resources (Sunday school, confirmation, trusted adults and mentors, Bibles, etc.) to help your students explore their faith.

One of my goals that's been building since I first arrived was to set up a schedule where St. David would distribute Bibles at various times throughout a student's faith exploration. Part of the baptismal promises we make as our students are brought to Holy Baptism is that we will "place in their hands the holy scriptures." It's been a while since St. David has distributed Bibles to students regularly, and this is an important ministry that I'm eager to get started again!

Here's our NEW schedule for regular Bible distribution:

- Baptism. The first will be given at baptism. When children are baptized, part of what we are going to do right away is help fulfill that promise of placing into their hands the holy scriptures. Our baptism Bible will be a board book style so that these babies can love their Bibles well in the many ways babies love things, and the Bibles will last. (As Lutherans, most people the pastors baptize are babies, but if there are older children or adults who will be baptized, we'll make sure they get an age-appropriate Bible in place of the board Bible!) It's 20 of the most commonly read Bible stories boiled down to a few sentences with a main message at the end to help grown-ups talk to their babies about who God is and how God wants us to live. Most importantly, a Bible at this age helps establish a pattern of regularly using the Bible together with your students.
- **3 Years Old.** The next Bible will be given as they enter Sunday school/are in preschool. These are our 3/4-year-old Bibles. More in-depth than the board Bibles, these Bibles include more stories, but stories that are still very easy to understand. I know my preschooler's favorite thing to do is wonder. We get asked why we do things or what things mean more often than not, and this Bible encourages wondering about God and the stories in the Bible. Wonder is how we engage with the world and how we grow! After each story there's a question that prompts discussion with your student to encourage conversation about how you might wonder about God or the story or the world.
- 2nd Grade. After the preschool Bible, we'll give another Bible to our students entering 2nd grade. Since I stumbled across this Bible, I've been telling Pastor Greg how obsessed I am With it. It might be my favorite Bible ever, even for adults. It's a perfect in-between version: more in-depth than the younger elementary age Bible, but easier for upper elementary age students to understand than a full-fledged Bible. It continues to invite your students to wonder about these stories, and expands with a bit of context to the greater story, prayers that are easy to pray, and it includes different "paths" to take to continue exploring stories that emphasize the things God says are most important (i.e. Welcoming, loving each other, being comforted by God). It has maps and timelines and so many different ways for students who are learning to love their Bibles to explore their place in God's story.

• 6th Grade. The last Bible we're going to formally give students is when they enter confirmation in 6th grade. Part of the goal that Pastor Greg and I have for confirmation is for students to be able to make faith their own. This one will be a regular, "grown up" Bible with everything included. Instead of the NRSV Bibles we have in church, though, I've opted a different translation: the Common English Bible. It's easier to understand than the NRSV translation, which falls more into a high school (or beyond) reading level. It's a student study Bible, which means it has the history, context, and questions that encourage all the wondering they've done with their other Bibles AND with all they'll be discovering about faith in confirmation.

We're going to be playing catch up for the first years. So, if your student is in the "in-between" time or just missed the cut off to receive a Bible, please let me know. I'm never, ever going to not give out a Bible to a person who wants it, especially our young people. For example, if your student hasn't received a Bible but will be starting 3rd grade in the fall, it would be more than appropriate to distribute a Bible to them in the fall if that's something you would like them to have. Or, if you'd like to stop into my office to take a peek to see if your student would benefit from the one they've just missed or if you think they should wait for the next round of distribution, you're absolutely welcome to do so. Just let me know! (Confirmation students are automatically looped into this rule, so ALL rising 6th-9th grade students will all receive a Bible in the fall.)

Now that you have all this information, what's next?

Mark your calendars for Sunday, August 17. During the Sunday school hour, I will host a "getting to know your Bible" time for any adults and students who would like to know a little bit more about how to get the most use out of these new Bibles.

Send an email to me so I can make sure I have the right Bible ready for your student. This is part of the catch-up. I know who to expect for the grades listed in the new schedule, but I want to know which other students would like to receive a Bible this fall. To make sure we order enough, I need to hear from you as soon as possible!

Growing in God's Word

Try this craft as a reminder that we need to continue to grow in God's Word.

What you will need:

- Small terra cotta pot and plate
- Acrylic paints (various colors)
- Paper plate
- Potting soil (enough to fill the pot)
- Small inside plant (can be purchased at a garden nursery) or packet of seeds.



- Paintbrush
- Cup of water
- Permanent black marker



What you do:

- 1) Spread some newspapers out on a table for your working area.
- 2) Squeeze the paint colors that you wish to use onto your paper plate.
- 3) Paint designs on the pot and plate. Make sure you clean your brush in the cup of water when changing colors.
- 4) When the pot is dry, take the black marker and on the collar (top part of the pot) write: "Growing in God's Word"
- 5) Pour a small amount of potting soil into the bottom of the pot. With an adult's help, place your plant into the pot and surround your plant with the rest of the soil. If planting seeds, follow the packet instructions.
- 6) Water your plant so the soil is moist. Check your plant every day and keep the soil moist.
- 7) Enjoy watching your plant grow, and remember that you, too, need care as you grow in God's Word.
