FROM CONFUSION TO CONFESSION!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we enter the month of June together, we are blessed with the opportunity to celebrate the Day of Pentecost! As one of the principal feast days of the Christian Church, Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Church. Falling fifty days after Easter, the Day of Pentecost commemorates the pouring out of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. Initially, Luke's vivid account of the events of the day in Acts Chapter 2 describes what appears to be a time of confusion. Listen to his words: "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." (NRSV - Acts 2:1-4). As Luke continues, he describes the reaction of many in the crowd as confusion. While it may have seemed that way to many, Peter is quick to point out how these events are in reality the fulfillment of prophecy and God's plan. After recalling the words of the prophet Joel, Peter then testifies to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Peter then calls the people to repentance and baptism in a confession of faith in the risen Lord. Luke ends the chapter sharing how this faith became evident in the way the people lived in community through sharing, worship, and fellowship with glad and generous hearts. What an amazing transformation - from confusion to confession - through the power of the Holy Spirit!

While we may find ourselves facing events that lead to confusion in our world today, our confession of faith through the work and power of the Holy Spirit gives us the strength, promise, and reassurance of God's presence in our lives both individually and, more importantly, corporately together as Christ's Church! Martin Luther spoke of the gift and activity of the Holy Spirit so articulately in his explanation to the third article of the Apostles' Creed in *The Small Catechism*. As we celebrate the Festival of Pentecost, it is a blessing to recall it: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one, common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins - mine and those of all believers. On the last day, the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true." (Small Catechism, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, Augsburg Fortress, 2006, p. 1162).

Know that while we may be separated by time and distance, you remain constantly in my prayers as you continue to live out our mission of proclaiming God's eternal grace to all people.

Things here have been eventful as well. The day we left South Carolina, I had the opportunity to baptize two little girls, the daughters of one of my Soldiers. It was a great way to officially begin our federal mission by gathering to remember that religious support to our Soldiers and their families remains a number one priority not only for my commander, but for all of our women and men serving in uniform. A spiritually fit Soldier is a mission capable Soldier.

I'm especially grateful of the ways that you are caring for my family in these days, particularly since I've left the Columbia area. I cannot begin to think about how glad I'll be to fly into the yellow pollen dome that encapsulates our home in the springtime next year. While my sinuses won't appreciate it, my heart certainly will.

Currently I am at Fort Bliss, Texas, but shortly after you receive this letter I will have arrived to my regular duty station across the big pond. I'll be really glad to trade the hot desert temperatures for something a bit more temperate in Europe. I keep hearing that this heat is ok because it is a dry heat, but I'm fairly certain that the turkey says the same thing in the oven while cooking on Thanksgiving.

As always, I remain grateful that you continue to fight the good fight of the faith, maintaining and even expanding the ministries that we are called to carry out in our corner of the world in West Columbia. I can't wait to see pictures of VBS and kids enjoying their time at camp, and the youth going to the beach. Each of these opportunities are incredibly important as we seek to build our young people in to confidant, capable disciples of Jesus Christ. The ways that you support our young people and honor the covenant you made with them and God in Holy Baptism to pray for and support them in their new life in Christ continues to amaze me. Keep up the good work!

Please continue to carry the Soldiers and families of the 678th Air Defense Artillery Brigade in your prayers and know that we are praying for you, too! No amount of time or distance will be able to separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus our Lord.

May God's peace be our journey together for the sake of the world that God so loves.

May 2022 Council Highlights

The St. David Congregation Council met in its regular monthly meeting on Sunday May 15, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the Conference Room. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

- *Worship & Music: The handbells will be sent out for repair in June.
- *Learning: VBS is coming up June 13-16. Classes will be offered for nursery through adult. Helpers of all ages are needed and volunteers are urged to contact Joel Antley or Amy Ruple if interested.
- * **Technology:** A committee to update The Instant Church Directory is being formed.
- *Property: Council approved a recommendation from the property committee to have Brookegreen Landscaping remove the shrubbery from around the church for \$13,000.00. Most of the shrubbery is either dead or diseased. Brookegreen will remove, haul off and replace all the shrubbery with mulch. Consideration for replanting will be at a later time.
- *Finance: Easter Offering was \$1,472.00. Building Maintenace and Snack Packs will receive \$736.00 each.
- *Athletic: The committee is making plans to start softball in the fall.
- *Hispanic Ministry: St David donated \$500.00 to Cristo Rey in honor of the 15th anniversary of their founding.
- *Safety: Sixteen members were trained in first aid, CPR, and use of the AED. It was recommended that training be offered annually in April.
- *Youth and Family Ministry: Council approved \$2,000.00 to help defray the cost of the youth beach trip scheduled for July 24 –30. The youth will do some mission work in the area while at the beach. This trip is taking the place of the cancelled ELCA National Youth Gathering.
- *Ukraine: St David sent \$3,000.00 to Ukraine disaster relief matching funds. \$500.00 of that was given by Lutheran Men.
- *Medical Equipment: A collection of used durable medical equipment has been given to the church through the years. Several volunteers are being sought to inventory, clean, and dispense the items to members who have need of a wheelchair, walker, bedside toilet, etc.
- *New Members: Steve Pullie, Betty Cox, Tim Roberson, Glenda Boozer have been approved for membership and will be formally received on June 5.
- *Deployment: Pastor Greg is currently serving in Texas until June when his unit, the 678th Air Defense Artillery Brigade will leave for Germany. Johnna Kent, volunteer with the unit is making a list of items that will be needed over the course of the coming year. She will be available to speak to various groups about specific needs in the coming weeks. More information will be shared with the congregation as it is made available.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.



A Special Treat for a

Special Dad

Fathers work hard to take care of their families. To thank your special dad for all he does, make him a treat bag that he can enjoy while at work, in the car or at home.

What you need:


- gift bag, paper lunch bag, plastic container or large Ziploc® bag.
- markers or cravons
- paper (81/2" x 11") or smaller
- ribbon, stickers, photograph of your dad (optional)
- glue
- scissors
- large bowl for mixing
- spoon
- 1/4 or 1/2 measuring cup
- your dad's favorite snacks to make a mix. For example: small pretzels, nuts, M&M's®, dried cereals (Cheerios®, Chex®, etc.), chocolate or carob chips, dried fruit (cranberries, raisins, apricots, etc.), shredded coconut, etc.

What to do:

- 1. Cut your paper to fit on your bag or container.
- 2. Decorate your paper with a message like: "A Special Treat for My Special Dad!"
- 3. Glue your message onto the bag or container.
- 4. Add stickers, photographs or more drawings to the container or bag.
- 5. Pour 1/4 or 1/2 cup of each snack food into a large mixing bowl.
- 6. Stir your snack mixture with a spoon, and then pour it into the bag or container.
- 7. Fold the top of the bag, or close the container. (Use a ribbon or stapler if needed.) Ask for help from an adult to make sure the snack will not fall out.
- 8. Thank your dad, and then give him this special treat and a big hug!
