Dear Friends in Christ,

March has arrived, and with it the quiet invitation Lent always brings: to slow down, to return, to notice where God is at work in us and among us. This is not a season for perfection. It is a season for paying attention. A season for honest prayer, simple practices, and renewed hope.

Join Us for Lenten Vespers – Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.

This year our Wednesday night Lenten Vespers series is centered on stewardship — not just about budgets or pledges, but about the beautiful, grace-filled truth that *everything* is a gift. Our time, our stories, our relationships, our congregation — all entrusted to us by a generous God.

Each week we'll gather for worship, song, reflection, and prayer as we explore what it means to live as stewards of God's abundance. It's midweek worship designed to ground you, not burden you. Come as you are. Come even if Lent hasn't "felt" very Lenten yet. There's always room.

Bring a friend. Bring your questions. Bring your tired heart.

We have also begun the process of searching for our next Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministries. This is an exciting and important step for our congregation as we look toward the future God is shaping among us.

I'd like to invite each of you to join us in this search process. Here are three ways we'd love your help:

1. **Pray** — for the search team, for clarity, and for the person God is already preparing.
2. **Dream** — about who we are called to be for the children, youth, and families of our congregation and community.
3. **Encourage** — our young people and the adults who walk alongside them. Your presence matters more than you know.

Transitions are holy moments. They stretch us, but they also remind us that this is Christ's church. The Spirit is not finished with us yet.

Lent is a journey we take together. So, if you've been meaning to return to worship, this is your nudge. This is your invitation to take your faith deeper, and engage in new ways with your faith by becoming active in the ministries of our congregation. If what you're looking for is a space and place to find peace and quiet to just breathe and pray, stop by anytime. Lent doesn't ask us to have everything figured out. It asks us to show up — trusting that God meets us here.

I am grateful for you — for your faithfulness, your generosity, your humor, and your deep love for this community. I see signs of resurrection already.

St. David Church Council Highlights February 2026

The St. David Lutheran Church Congregational Council met Sunday February 8, 2026 at noon (after church service, due to Super Bowl Sunday) for the monthly meeting. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

Committee Reports:

Learning: Vacation Bible School will be June 15-18, 2026. They will soon be reaching out for volunteers to help.

WELCA: Funeral meal preparation has been divided into 4 groups within the church that will rotate on a regular basis. General meeting will be on February 15, 2026.

Safety: Josh Temples is working on replenishing the first aid kits around the church (mainly band aids needed). Annual safety team meeting soon to be scheduled.

Snack Packs: One hundred and twenty snack packs are being constructed each week of the month of February.

Youth: Pastor Greg will continue meeting with youth on the 4th Sunday of each month. Parents of youth will be asked to help put on a youth event.

Pastor's Report was submitted to the council.

Treasurer's Report was submitted to the council.

Old Business

Council Retreat has been rescheduled to February 22 following worship. The agenda will focus on church committees, constitution review, and the Youth and Family position.

Council decided to seek a lay person for the open Youth and Family position first, with flexibility regarding part-time or full-time employment status. Chris Dooley is chairing the search committee, and they are in the process of finalizing the details of the job description.

New Business

Council heard about a partnership opportunity with a Lutheran church in Guatemala through ILAG (Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala). Council agreed to enter St. David Lutheran Church into a three-year partnership with \$1,500 annual buy in. Council expressed interest in having groups of the church make contributions toward this sum, especially for the first year of our partnership.

The council meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

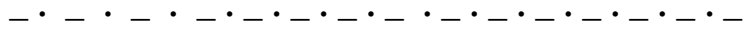
