Dear Friends in Christ,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Though Easter Sunday may have passed, the Easter season is far from over. In the church calendar, Easter is not just one day—it is a season, stretching across seven joyful weeks and leading us to Pentecost, on June 8. During this time, we continue to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and reflect on the profound hope it brings to our daily lives.

In the light of the empty tomb, we are called to live as Easter people. And one of the clearest ways we live out the resurrection is by loving our neighbors.

The resurrection isn't just a moment in history; it is the heartbeat of our faith. It tells us that light is stronger than darkness, that love is stronger than hate, and that life triumphs over death. For those early disciples, the risen Jesus met them in gardens, on roads, and in locked rooms. He met them in their doubt, their grief, and their fear. And he meets us in the same places today.

Jesus' resurrection was not the end of the story—it was the beginning of the church's mission to carry God's love into every corner of the world. That mission begins right where we are: in our homes, our neighborhoods, our schools, our workplaces. It begins with the people next door, across the street, or even the ones we pass without noticing.

Loving our neighbors doesn't have to mean grand gestures. Sometimes it looks like checking in on someone who's lonely, offering a meal to a struggling family, or simply listening—really listening—to someone who needs to be heard. It also means standing with those who are hurting, speaking up for the voiceless, and working for peace and justice wherever we can.

As we journey through this Easter season, may we also be witnesses to the resurrection. How can we embody the risen Christ in our communities? In our workplaces? In our homes? Every act of grace, every word of kindness, and every gesture of peace is a sign that resurrection is still happening—that new life is still breaking in.

May we be known not only by our Easter hymns, but by our Easter lives—lives that shine with compassion, mercy, and kindness. As Christ has loved us, let us go and love the world in Jesus' name.

Christmas has twelve days. Easter has eight weeks. Easter carols have been around for centuries and the eight Sundays give us plenty of time to extend the celebration. Wesley had a hand in this carol, but also wrote his own version:

Christ the Lord Is Risen Today, Alleluia! Sons of men and angels say, Alleluia! Raise your Joys and Triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth reply, Alleluia!


Put your letter or puzzle pieces in the envelope. Address the envelope, put the stamp on and mail it to your friend or deliver it in person.



FROM THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE: Having a Family Square Does NOT Mean You Have a Burial Plot!

In the past, "family squares" were set aside for families, usually when a patriarch passed (St. David no longer sets aside "family squares"). These squares consist of multiple neighboring burial plots often surrounded by coping and covered with gravel. However, it does not mean burial plots within the square were assigned to anyone specific. The result is way too many (248!) unassigned burial plots.

Though St. David has a large cemetery, the number of burial spaces are becoming fewer. Therefore, the Cemetery Committee, with Church Council approval, asks family members with an existing "family square" to submit burial requests to officially secure their plot, or to surrender unused plots back to the church for reassignment by the end of the year. Expect a letter soon if you are affected which will have more information on next steps.
