This November's celebration of Homecoming will mark 180 years since St. David Lutheran Church was organized. At every church I serve, each year during this time of year I make sure to remember how momentous all of those years of history are, and my time at St. David has been no different. 180 years is a big deal because there's a rich and thick history in which many of St. David's members take pride.

When I first came to St. David, I was intimidated by that number. That's a really long time by church standards. We've had exceptional pastors and interns who have went on to do great things in the church and in the world, one of which is currently serving as this congregation's senior pastor. We've had female clergy who have helped pave the way for pastors like me. We've had musicians and lay leaders serve and love the church in good times and in bad. We've had dedicated members who have been here for a good number of those 180 years.

Now, don't get me wrong. It hasn't always been easy. I can't imagine it was a walk in the park for the church planters of 1845. I know that we've been on hilltops and in valleys when it comes to our worship attendance and our participation numbers for children's and music ministries. There have been pandemics, deaths, departures, and transitions that have shaken the core of this church.

Reformation is near the top of my favorite church celebrations. And, on Reformation Sunday, we had the privilege of confirming seven 8th and 9th graders who have been—and will continue to be—exceptional members of the congregation. From my experience in churches, there are always at least a few comments about how 50ish years ago the confirmation classes were in the triple digits. That's super cool! And, it isn't the reality of many churches in the United States anymore, for many reasons. Much of this reminiscing is a good thing, don't get me wrong! We look back with joy on a church that is still here and on a hilltop, so to speak. We get to remember how when we were younger, we did [insert cool thing] at St. David, which made you love the church and want to come back.

Reminiscing about "St. David of the past" can be a good thing, as long as we don't let it affect our present-day ministries. It's important to look back at where we started (the past 180 years), *and* it's important to look at how far we've come (where we are *now*) and forward to where we are going (dream about the next 180 years).

Dear friends, St. David is in an incredible place right now. We're building programs, and it's going really, really well. Being your associate pastor who is in charge of faith formation here, you'll often hear me talking about the amazing youth activities and programs that are being (re)built. But this isn't just about that. It's about the growing number of quilts for Lutheran World Relief that get sewn every year and are packed, shipped, and delivered around the world. It's about snack packs that get stuffed and dropped off at Oak Grove Elementary every other month. It's about the volunteers who show up at the drop of a hat to prepare and serve funeral meals. It's about the upcoming Advent and Christmas traditions anchoring us to the past while reminding us that the church is a place that's always changing.

And, what is also true is that the church changes to meet people where they are. There are lots of ways to keep the memories of St. David alive while also embracing the church as it is right now, and also while dreaming for the future of what we want St. David to be.

Two things are true: the Church might not look like it did 180 years ago, or 50 years ago, or even how it looked yesterday. *And*, it's still a great place to be. Please continue showing up, and find ways to get plugged in. If you need some help figuring out what that looks like for you, talk to me or Pastor Greg.

We've come a long way, and we still have a big horizon in front of us. And **that** is worth celebrating. In love,

"Thankful 🏠 Garland"


What you need:

- construction paper in a variety of fall colors
- pencil, marker or crayons
- yarn, ribbon or raffia
- scissors
- hole-punch
- spray bottle filled with water
- (optional) real leaves
- (optional) wooden or plastic beads, cereal with holes (Cheerios, Froot Loops, etc.) or any dried pasta with a hole



What to do:

- 1. Draw or trace leaf shapes onto construction paper.
- 2. Lay the construction paper sheets flat and spray the paper with water from the spray bottle until the paper is completely wet.
- 3. Crumple the wet paper into balls.
- 4. Open the crumpled paper and let the sheets dry flat.
- 5. When dry, cut out each leaf.
- 6. On each leaf, write the name of one person or one thing for which you are thankful.
- 7. Punch a hole in each leaf.
- 8. Lace the thankful leaves, beads, cereal and pasta onto the yarn, ribbon or raffia.
- 9. Tie the ends and hang your garland.
