LET YOUR LIGHT SHINE!

I once heard an old folk tale about a church built in the center of a community. Made of stone, it was a beautiful building – large enough for all in the community to gather at one time for worship. The people of the parish were filled with anticipation as they awaited the first worship service. Finally the time came. The great doors were opened, and the people filed in. It didn't take but a moment for them to realize that something was missing. There were no candles...there was no light. One of the members turned to the priest and exclaimed, "where is the light?" The priest smiled, and then began handing out lanterns. As he did so, he would light a candle in each lantern, then hand the lantern to each family. The light began to spread, revealing interior details which only added beauty to the sanctuary. The priest then pointed to the walls and to suspended chandeliers – where the people saw iron hooks. The priest then explained,

"When we gather together for worship, light your lantern, bring it, and hang it on your hook. As each of you does so, the light in the sanctuary will grow as we gather in community for worship, word, and sacrament. When you are not here, your hook will be empty and in the shadows and our sanctuary and fellowship – not quite as bright. You see, by sharing our light with one another, the gift of light is brought to the community. Each one of us has light to share!"

I thought about that story and our admonition from Matthew 5:16 that we proclaim at baptism: Let your light so shine before others, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Each one of us has light to share — Christ's light! The late Dr. J. Benjamin Bedenbaugh of our Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary once said, "Christ's light is not meant so much to simply shine on us, but more importantly, through us!" How is Christ's light shining forth in and through your life bringing glory to your Father in heaven? That is our baptismal admonition and calling! Let your light shine!

During the coverage of the death of Elizabeth II, her deep faith was mentioned many times. She lived through many events where her faith must have been tested, and also relied upon. She was quoted as having said that she wished that the Lord would return while she lived, so that she could place her crown at his feet. What an amazing statement from a world leader.

In times of stress, we seemingly have nothing left to depend on except faith.

This was the case for 22-year-old Ray Palmer. He was lonely and exhausted, working full time, teaching part-time, and going to school to prepare for the ministry. He met Lowell Mason, a church musician who was planning to publish a hymnal. Mason asked young Palmer for some verses. Palmer, too tired to think about another project, gave him this poem, written earlier on a lonely night when he was feeling overwhelmed. He had written it without effort, for it came from the depths of his own soul. Mason took it home and was so moved that he wrote the music for it that same night. No other music setting has been used for this hymn. The tune is called OLIVET, possibly reflecting the anguish of our Lord on the Mount of Olives.

This popular American hymn was widely shared by Civil War soldiers. Palmer eventually got his doctorate in theology from Princeton and wrote many hymns, but this one hymn, coming from his soul, is a great comfort to many.

Highlights from the September 2022 St. David Church Council Meeting

The St. David Congregation Council met in its regular monthly meeting on Sunday, September 11, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the Conference Room. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

Worship & Music: St. David is reactivating and hosting the Community Thanksgiving Service on Sunday, November 20. Fellowship Baptist, Mt. Zion AME and Oakwood Baptist churches will be invited and will be involved in the service. Pastor Fred will be contacting the pastors of those churches with an invitation to come together for that worship opportunity.

Homecoming at St. David is set for Sunday, November 13 with Pastor Will Rose scheduled to deliver the sermon. Pastor Rose is a former intern who served at St. David in the 1990s.

Council gave approval for robes for the Children's Choir to be ordered with monies from an anonymous donor.

Support: Work continues on updating the Instant Church Directory. Anyone wishing to update their information should contact Danny Shull.

Interim Pastor: Pastor Suhr will be away September 19-20.

Evangelism: The Bread Breakers group will have a kickoff meeting after church on Sunday, October 2. A new members welcome and recognition is planned for October.

Service: American Red Cross blood drives are scheduled in 2023 for February 13, June 26, October 23.

Director of Youth & Family Ministries: Council previously approved a ski trip planned for the youth for January 14-16, 2023. A cabin has now been reserved for those dates.

Athletics: The committee plans a youth basketball league for the fall and winter. Details will be shared as soon as available.

Church Sign: Work on the sign is progressing. The frame is being constructed, and the LED light board has been received by the sign company. Several trees will have to be removed or limbed before installation. Projected installation is before Christmas.

Council: Congregational nominations for 2023 Council members will be held on Sunday, October 2.

Treasurer's Report: A spending plan for 2023 will be developed and discussed at the October Council meeting.

Safe Haven: Carrie Nettles from the Julie Valentine Center in Greenville presented a Safe Haven workshop for St. David volunteers working with children and youth on Saturday, September 4. All staff and volunteers working as teachers, mentors, or leaders are required to take the training as per church policy.

Pastor Greg/Deployment: Council approved a request for freewill donations from the congregation to help defray the cost of airline tickets to Germany for Pastor Greg's family at Christmas.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
