Dear St. David Family and Friends,

Their young son was observing their preparation with great interest. He watched as Dad went to the bookshelves in the family room, and took down a huge book from the top shelf. Dad carefully laid the book on the coffee table. The little boy walked over to get a closer look. The book was very fancy, large, and thick. Turning to his father the little guy asked, "Dad, whose book is this?" Dad responded, "Why that's the family Bible – it's God's book." The boy looked back at the book, then he ran his hand across the cover prompting a large dust bunny to form. Turning once again to his father, the little fellow said, "Well we better give it back to him because we're sure not using it..."

One of my favorite weekly activities at St. David are our Bible studies! Each week, on Tuesday evening at 7:00 pm, or on Wednesday morning at 10:30 am, members and friends of St. David gather to study and reflect on the Scripture readings for the upcoming Sunday service. The discussion and fellowship are wonderful blessings as we explore God's Word and spend time together! One of the greatest gifts that God gives us is the Word. Sometimes, there is a temptation to take that gift for granted. When we do, we miss amazing opportunities to be nurtured or strengthened in our faith.

Martin Luther understood just how important it was to intentionally spend time in reading, hearing, and studying God's Word. In fact, he considered it so important that he translated scripture into the language of the people so that they could read and study God's Word firsthand! For Luther, the Bible – God's book – wasn't intended to be a seed bed for dust bunnies – but for faith!

If we don't take the time to hear and spend time in God's Word – in Bible studies, at home, in Worship, in Sunday School... our faith and our relationship with God are impacted. As summer comes to an end and we enter September, I would like to invite, encourage, challenge, and pray for each of us to commit ourselves to intentionally take time – also a gift from God – to spend time in the Word! J. Rippon 1787

John Rippon was pastor of Carter's Lane Baptist Church in London for 63 years! While there, he published a collection of hymns in 1787. How firm a Foundation first appeared in that collection, with the author's name as only "K". The hymn quotes the Bible in its seven verses. Our foundation for faith is based on God's Word and his promises:

- Isaiah 41:10 Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.
- Isaiah 43:2 When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, nor shall the flame scorch you.
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness. Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.
- Hebrews 13:5 For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

And finally, God says to us:

Throughout all their lifetime my people shall prove my sov'reign, eternal, unchangeable love; and then, when gray hairs shall their temples adorn, like lambs they shall still in my bosom be borne.

Highlights from the August 2022 St. David Church Council Meeting

The St. David Congregation Council met in its regular monthly meeting on Sunday, August 14, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the conference room. The following items were discussed and action taken as needed.

Worship and Music: There was a discussion on whether to serve meals before the upcoming Advent services. There continues to be low attendance for the meals. A motion was made and unanimously passed to discontinue the meals before the Advent Services this year. The program will be reevaluated prior to the Lenten services.

Learning: Rally Day for the new Sunday School year is Sunday, September 18th. Low attendance has been an issue this year, but the committee is pressing ahead with excitement and enthusiasm for the new Sunday School year. Additional teachers are needed. Volunteers can contact Jennifer Jeffcoat or Ben Bernstein. All Sunday School and Youth volunteers are required to be trained on the St. David Safe Haven Policy. Training will be held on Sunday, September 4, beginning at 3:00 pm in the conference room. Carrie Nettles, Victim Service Specialist at The Julie Valentine Center in Greenville, SC, will conduct the training.

As part of the Communication Project, Sunday School will be highlighted in the September Lamplighter.

YAH: The group hosted approximately 25 residents from the Lowman Home on August 9th for a meal and fellowship.

Tech Support: Danny Shull continues to update contact information on members for the Instant Church Directory and the 360 program. Danny and Gene Palmer have been training members on how to download and use the Instant Church Directory app.

Property: All major property projects have been completed, including the parking lot refurbishment. There is one outstanding minor project in progress. One of the garage roll-up doors is broken. The part needed for the repair has been ordered.

Evangelism: The Bread Breakers groups will begin meeting September 19th.

Treasurer: The July financial report was submitted for information.

Drew reported that the company being consulted on the gym floor renovation is not interested or available to do the work. The project is on indefinite hold.

Military Care: Plans will be forthcoming for future mailings this fall. Information on specific needs will be posted in the usual communication outlets.

Church Sign: The LED lightboard has been ordered and received by SignTech, and fabrication of the actual sign structure will begin. The expectation is that the sign will be installed before Christmas.

New Intern: Isaac Taylor, new intern assigned to St. David, will be starting his duties on September 1st.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


ARE YOU LOOKING FOR A NEW WAY to engage in fellowship with your brothers and sisters at St. David? Beginning this fall, we're starting a new ministry called Bread Breakers. It is a monthly opportunity to gather with other members of the congregation to enjoy some fellowship and a meal. You can either meet in your homes or go out to a restaurant, whichever your group chooses to do is fine! Here's the catch—the groups are assigned at random! This way, each year you'll have a new group to get to know and will have the opportunity to develop relationship with folks in the congregation that you might not otherwise get to know outside of Sunday mornings. Each group will typically be 6-8 people, a mix of singles and couples, from different age groups. - 3 cups of flour
- 1-1/2 cups salt
- 6 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 3 cups of water
- 3-4 tablespoons oil
- food coloring
- glitter (optional)

- 2 cups baking soda
- 1-1/2 cups water
- 1 cup cornstarch

In a pan, mix the ingredients with a fork until smooth. With an adult's help, boil the mixture over medium heat until thick. Spoon onto a plate or wax paper, and let cool.



Oatmeal Clay

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 2/3 cup flour
- 1/2 cup water
- food coloring

Mix all the ingredients in a large bowl. Add more flour if necessary for the dough to form a lump. Knead the dough on a floured surface until it is smooth. Add food coloring to the water before mixing the dough, or divide into balls and add coloring after mixed and kneaded.
