From the Pastor

"The story of Christmas is as much about comfort and joy as it is about how messed up our world actually is."

— Accidental Saints, Nadia Bolz-Weber (pg. 76)

Throughout the book *Accidental Saints*, by Nadia Bolz-Weber, we hear stories where Nadia is surprised by God's grace. Sometimes it's that she doesn't feel deserving of the grace extended to her. Other times, she doesn't want to extend grace to someone, but then someone comes along who reminds her of how we are to extend God's love to one another even when we sometimes do not like one another. It's a reminder that God's grace doesn't follow our plans or our roles. It simply meets us where we are.

Christmas tells the same truth. God enters the world not through ideal circumstances, but through a young couple far from home. The birth of Jesus teaches us that God is still showing up in the places we might hurry past—humble, ordinary, sometimes inconvenient places that don't look sacred at first glance.

During this season, when our calendars fill quickly, it might help to remember that God doesn't wait for everything to be calm and bright. Grace doesn't require a perfect mood or a spotless house. Sometimes the holiest moments come during a difficult conversation, a messy kitchen, a long line at the store, or a tired hug at the end of a stressful day. God loves to work with real life—our real life—not the idealized version we imagine we're supposed to offer.

As we move toward Christmas, perhaps we can practice looking twice. When someone interrupts us, when a conversation takes unexpected depth, when we're surprised by kindness or convicted by honesty—this is God's grace meeting us where we are.

May this season open our eyes to the small miracles around us. May we find warmth in unlikely places and the presence of God in moments that don't look the least bit "churchy." For that is the heart of Christmas: God comes close, right in the middle of our ordinary lives, and calls it holy.

Emanuel Seminarian—Thanks and Update, Flowers for Worship

People of Emanuel,

Thank you so much for the generous financial support you have provided during my seminary education over the past few years. Most recently with monies from the Designated Giving and Christian Education Endowment funds. It has been greatly appreciated and helpful to cover the multiple expenses I have had throughout the period of formation thus far. In addition, I'd like to share a brief update with the congregation regarding my life as of late. It has been a busy and exciting year!

This spring I finished my year of ministerial fieldwork, serving on Sundays at St. Peter Lutheran Church in Mechanicsburg, PA before serving as a CPE intern (student chaplain) at Havenwood Heritage Heights retirement community in Concord, NH this past summer. Both of these experiences helped assist in my formation of vital skills for ministry, and I am deeply grateful for how I have grown through these avenues of formation.

I'm also excited to share that I became engaged early this summer to my fiancée Noelle, who is a fellow seminarian. We will be getting married at her home congregation on December 5th and are looking forward to our life together!

Currently, I am finishing my final semester of seminary coursework before embarking on internship. I am taking a full courseload which includes classes on church administration, liberation theology, intersectional leadership, the Gospel of John, and rural and small church ministry.

I am also proud to say that this year I was chosen to receive the ELCA Fund for Leaders Mission Developer Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded yearly for up to seven ELCA seminarians across the country who have been identified as having the gifts to serve in mission development. Rostered leaders in mission development are responsible for organizing and creating new ministries and communities in the ELCA. Earlier this month, I am also pleased to share that I received a positive "Endorsement" decision from the synod's candidacy committee. This is the second of the three steps toward ordained ministry in the ELCA. This affirmation from the committee allows me to move forward in the candidacy process and begin my yearlong internship.

In January, I will begin serving as Vicar at Trinity Lutheran Church in Chelmsford, MA before sitting for approval for ordination about a year from now. I am grateful for all the ways I have been formed for ministry so far and look forward to serving in this new role and seeing how the Holy Spirit continues to call.

In your email, please specify the rate that best applies to your family situation.

Rate 1: \$1105/week (This rate reflects the true cost of camp.)

Rate 2: \$980/week (Rate for families for whom the full cost of camp is out of reach. Rate is subsidized by generous donors.)

<u>Rate 3</u>: \$855/week (This rate covers a portion of the true cost and is subsidized by generous donations by individuals and congregations.)

Then indicate the amount of campership that will meet your needs.

Emanuel will apply the campership to the rate selected above.

100% 75% 50% 25%

Each camper's registration fee, \$50, will be covered by Emanuel and added to each campership award.

Don't delay! Let us know your plans now so that we can help send kids to camp.

Please let us know your plans ASAP but not later than December 31, 2025.

Healing Prayer Sundays are held on the first Sunday of every month at Emanuel.

On Healing Prayer Sundays we bless our prayer shawls. If you would like to bring one to someone in need, they are available to take after worship. Personal healing prayer is offered to people who wish to receive it at the altar immediately following the postlude.



Emanuel has an AED (Automated external defibrillator) which is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet also easy-to-use, medical device that can deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart reestablish an effective rhythm. **Our AED is located in the**

office hallway, just outside of the church office. Proceed down the ramp in the sanctuary, and the AED is on the wall directly in front of you.


