From the Pastor

*Wait for the LORD;
be strong, and let your heart take courage;
wait for the LORD!*

—Psalm 27:14

On the last Sunday of November, we enter a new and sacred time in the Church year—Advent. For many, this season is marked by holiday music, busy calendars, buying gifts, and the anticipation of Christmas. But in the Church, Advent offers something deeper—a holy pause, a time to wait, watch, and prepare for the coming of Christ.

Advent is a time of hopeful anticipation, where we reflect on the light Christ brings into a dark and weary world. Each Sunday of Advent, we light a candle on the Advent wreath, gradually bringing more light into our worship. Each candle represents a theme:

1. Hope
2. Peace
3. Joy
4. Love

In this season, we are invited to more than just passive waiting—sitting and twiddling our thumbs. Advent is a call to prepare our hearts and lives. It is a time to:

- ♦ Slow down in a busy season
- ♦ Pray and reflect on God's promises
- ♦ Repent and turn back to what matters most
- ♦ Serve others with generosity and love

The world may rush toward Christmas, but we walk intentionally through Advent, knowing that Christ comes not only in a manger long ago, but again and again into our lives, our worship, and our world.

As we move through Advent, may we make space in our hearts and lives for the One who is coming. Let us prepare the way of the Lord—not just for Christmas Day, but for the transformation Advent invites us into every day.

Events and Items of Interest

Healing Prayer Sundays are held on the first Sunday of every month at Emanuel.

On Healing Prayer Sundays we bless our prayer shawls. If you would like to bring one to someone in need, they are available to take after worship. Personal healing prayer is offered to people who wish to receive it at the altar immediately following the postlude.



Emanuel has an AED (Automated external defibrillator) which is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet also easy-to-use, medical device that can deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart reestablish an effective rhythm. **Our AED is located in the office hallway, just outside of the church office. Proceed down the ramp in the sanctuary, and the AED is on the wall directly in front of you.**

closets at Emanuel have been

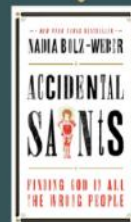
extensively searched, and the crown is unable to be located.

MACC Emergency Food Pantry needs our help!!!

Due to the ongoing government shutdown, delayed our unavailable SNAP benefits, and new DSS eligibility guidelines, many families in our community are facing food insecurity for the very first time. MACC is asking local congregations to join them in creating EMERGENCY BAGS OF FOOD to provide immediate relief to struggling families who are not registered clients of MACC.

Items to include in an Emergency Bag: (non-perishable and shelf stable items)

- ♦ peanut butter & jelly
- ♦ canned tuna & mayonnaise
- ♦ pasta and pasta sauce
- ♦ mac & cheese
- ♦ crackers
- ♦ nutri-grain or granola bars
- ♦ boxed cereal



You can fill your own paper bag(s) and bring them to the Community Emergency Food Pantry located at 460 Main Street, Manchester or you can bring in items to Emanuel and put them in the designated baskets in the narthex.
